through 2 Samuel 3:17. As we look at this time period, notice all the things that

✓ David leaves Michal; while running from Saul he went from Gibeah to Ramah, to Nob to Gath to Adullam Psalm 34; from there he went to Ziph, to Horesh, to Maon (Abigail) to Gibeah to Gath to Ziklag					
✓ David marries 2 other women; Abigail and Ahinoam 1 Samuel 25:43					
✓ Saul gave Michal to Palti in marriage; 1 Samuel 25:44					
✓ David uses Michal as a bargaining tool; 2 Samuel 3:13-16					
David uses wiichai as a barganning tool, 2 Sanider 3.13-10

As you reflect on the twists and turns in Michal's life, what kind of impact has your negative or unfair experiences had on your life?					
*Michal's response to David: 2 Samuel 6:15-23  ✓ Her heart: verses 15-16  As David and his men were transporting the Ark back to Jerusalem he began to dance and shout for joy. While they were dancing, leaping, and shouting Michal was filled with contempt. Some translations say, she him in her heart. In other words she looked upon him with scorn as if he was worthless or despicable.					
√ Her words; verse 20					
<ul> <li>✓ Her words: verse 20</li> <li>After David had finished celebrating, they sacrificed offerings and offerings and he blessed the people and gave every Israelite man</li> </ul>					
and woman in the crowd a loaf of bread, cake of dates and cake of raisins. When he came home, Michal met him outside saying, "How distinguished the king of Israel looked today, shamelessly exposing himself to the servant girls like any vulgar person might do!"					
<ul> <li>✓ Her consequence: verse 23</li> <li>The bible tells us that Michal had children to the day of her death.</li> </ul>
