Various Scriptures

Then the disciples came up and asked him, "Why are you speaking to them in parables?" He answered them, "Because the secrets of the kingdom of heaven have been given for you to know, but it has not been given to them. -Matthew 13:10-11

What comes to mind when you hear the phrase "kingdom of heaven"?
Do you believe the church today promotes more about it's buildings and programs or walking in the authority of the kingdom of heaven? Why or why not?
Basileia; Greek word for kingdom, sovereignty, power.
As members of the body of Christ it is very important that we understand and live out God's kingdom plan with the power He has given us. In order to do this, we must constantly read His word ask, "How is God encouraging in His word to promote His kingdom?"
#1 He encourages us to spread the Word
Parable of the Sower: Matthew 13:1-23; Mark 4:1-20; Luke 8:4-15
Context: Jesus has been traveling throughout the region; every city and village preaching and bringing the glad tidings of
Luke 8:1). Whenever it was discovered that Jesus was in town people would gather to hear Him speak. At this particular time Jesus was in a boat near the shore and He began speaking to the people along the shore in parables.
Let's consider the sowerMatthew 13:3-8 *He went out to sow; A farmer cannot sow seed from inside, he has to get up and get outside in the elements.
*He threw his seeds on all types of ground; some seed fell along the, other seed fell on ground, other seed fell among, other seed fell on ground.

thorns? Is he irresponsible for scattering seeds at random? Why or why not?

When distress or persecution comes because of the word, immediately he falls away. These are the people who stayed awake during the sermon. They heard the word, received it, and was encouraged by it. What are some practical things we can do to stay focused when we hear the word of God?

What can we do to stay focused on the kingdom of heaven?
*Good ground, producing fruit: some a hundred, some sixty, and some thirty times what was sown. Jesus says this is the one who hears and understands the word, who does produce fruit and yields; some a hundred, some sixty, some thirty times what was sown.
If you were to hear this parable without Jesus' explanation would you still be able to understand it?
Now that we have heard the word and Jesus has given us a better understanding, what type of soil will you be?
-Remember our soil can either encourage us or us from receiving the word of God.
Notice the different levels of harvest:
1 seed yields 100 more; another seed yields 60 more; another seed yields 30 more
What can we do to ensure the soil of our heart remains good and able to produce a bountiful harvest for the glory of God? 1 Corinthians 3:6-9

Let's consider our sharing....

*Other seed fell among thorns, and the thorns came up and choked it. Jesus says, the seed among thorns is the one who hears the word, but the worries of this age

Certainly there will be times when we experience all of soils, but the key is when the Holy Spirit has us firmly planted in the good soil to use it as an opportunity to share Hiss word with others!

Jesus planted many seeds over 2,000 years ago and they have produced a bountiful harvest. However He wants you and I (His followers) to continue sowing seeds of the Good news today. Matthew 13:11-12; Matthew 28:19
