A man: (Jesus, a disciple, or)
Seed: (The Word of God)
*It is on the ground.
*it and grows, though he does not know how. 1 Corinthians
3:6-7; Acts 18:5-10
Verse 27 He sleeps and rises night and day; In other words, after the man sows the seeds, he then goes on in his day-to-day routine.
Soil: (The person(s) receiving the word)
After some time, the seed interacts with the soil mysteriously.
*It crop by itself, Isaiah 55:10-11
Notice the growth process; first the, then the,
and then the full on the head. Romans 5:1-5
What was the growth process like for the plant? Was it quick or gradual?

What does this parable mean?

The Parable of the Mustard Seed: Mark 4:30-32; Matthew 13:31-32; Luke 13:18-19						
Mustard seeds: are small round seeds of various mustard plants, ranging about 1 to 2 millimeters in diameter.

Mustard seed:						
Sown and planted in the soil, as it grew it became than all the other garden plants, and large branches, so that the birds of the sky can nest in its shade.

Interesting facts:						
*They are not easily killed. Mustard bushes can withstand high pressure and high A fire in the field will destroy everything except a mustard						
plant.						

Harvest: (End of the age)

*A fully grown black mustard bush only grows to about ft tall when planted in a garden. However, in the wild there are some rare, cases when they have grown to about 10-15 ft tall.
*It grows with attention (farmer), but it also grows on its own(God).
*A mustard plant is like a weed in that it sprouts quickly but can also lay dormant for years.
*The Pods of seeds on a mustard plant holds thousands of seeds so plant can give rise to more plants.
