Parables of Jesus part 15

"So he got up and went to his father. But while the son was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion. He ran, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him." -Luke 15:20

In consideration of those who are lost in sin, what are 3 things we can do to

encourage them about God's compassion?
Context: Jesus has been traveling throughout the region, crowds have gathered, some of the Pharisees are upset with him for talking and eating with sinners (Luke 15:1-2) In response he tells them 3 parables; the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. As Jesus turns his focus to the story of the lost son, he paints a vivid picture leaving them and us with a very important decision to make about how we respond to sinners and God's love.

How did the younger son bring shame to his father, family, and country?

According to Deuteronomy 21:17, what share of the estate would the the younger son be entitled to? When would he receive this? By asking for his share early, what did the younger son show?
Keep in mind, they didn't have banks and accounts like we do today, so in order for the father to grant his son's request he would have to sell some of his property. Furthermore to accept the inheritance means accepting responsibility to carry on providing for the family. This son was not looking for but for

(13-16) *gathered he had *traveled to a land *squandered his estate on living *received a job feeding pigs *ate the pigs food *no one gave him anything As the Pharisees were listening to this story unfold, how do you think it made them feel? Why? Then Jesus introduces a shift in the thinking of the younger son. Verse 17 says, When he came to his senses, Greek word: heautou is the pronoun of the 3 rd person; himself, herself, itself Jesus is saying, in his rebellion and disobedience, the younger son wasn't himself. One of the great traps of sin comes when we open ourselves up to our own selfish desires. It is in those moments that we can become spiritually blinded and lose our sense of direction. James 1:14 Have you ever been lost in sin and forgot who you were? How did you find your way? What can you do or say to help others who are spiritually blind and lost today? What happened when he came to his senses? 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The Love of the father: Luke 15:20

As the son comes closer to his home, more than likely he's overwhelmed with fear and shame. He wished his father was dead, left his community, and now he has lost everything. In those days, not only would the family reject this disgraced son, but the community would reject and banish him as well.

Whenever a Jew would squander his wealth to foreigners they would face Kezazah.

Kezazah: "the cutting off"

It was performed by breaking clay pots at the feet of the man as a visual symbol that the community rejected him forever.
