Context: As we continue our study it is important to note where we are in the passion week. Most scholars agree the day and time is Jesus has now departed the temple where the religious leaders challenged his authority and is speaking directly to his disciples about the end times. This parable is a further illustration to Jesus' revelation of the tribulation and His second coming.		
Parable of the Fig Tree: Matthew 24:32-35		
The parable of the fig tree is one of parables that are repeated in Matthew, Mark and Luke. The fact that it is given to us over and over again should not be viewed as a nuisance but an indication to its readers that this is a <u>very</u> <u>important subject.</u> Not only that, but this is a direct answer to the disciples question in Matthew 24:1-3.		
Did you know? The fig tree was a common fruit tree in Israel. It is mentioned many times in the Old Testament, especially as a description of the abundance of the land and an example of agricultural blessing. Fig trees are also used in the Bible as symbols or pictures to drive home a point much like in this text. Jeremiah 24:1-10; Hosea 9:10
