introduction

Palm Sunday, the gateway to Holy Week, is the first memorial to our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. This festive parade was His wedding march as He proceeded to seal with blood His Bridegroom's love for the human family.

It is, furthermore, a feast in honor of Christ the King. This is the first time during His earthly life that He allowed royal homage to be paid Him. On the basis of His kingship He was convicted and sentenced to die. He was a martyr to His royal title.

But Palm Sunday brings us face to face with suffering, for it introduces us to Christ's sacred Passion. We are to share our Master's burden. The liturgy therefore is quite "dramatic." Christ is in our midst, and by our actions we proclaim ourselves His disciples. We accompany Him along the road from Mount Olivet to the city gate, into the Holy City to stand with Him before His executioners, and finally outside the city walls to Golgotha to watch Him die.

This service has been carefully constructed to achieve these historic and traditional Palm Sunday themes. At the beginning there are songs of praise. There is the Palm Sunday message for this day in the proclaimed Word. Finally, there is the consecration of the palms and the blessings of those who carry them.

The service ends with "The Procession," in which the worshipers, carrying palms, follow out of the church into the world. The symbolism is this: as soldiers and martyrs of Christ, we accompany the Lord and King of martyrs into the strife (herein lies the real significance of the palms). This is a procession to honor the Conqueror over death and hell as He proceeds to the battlefield. Christians are marching with Christ, a train of heroes and conquerors!

The palms traditionally are taken home and placed where they can be a quiet reminder of the assurance of God's grace and of our commitment to Him.





epistle lesson

Philippians 2:5–11

[5] Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, [6] who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, [7] but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. [8] And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. [9] Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, [10] so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, [11] and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.


gospel for palm sunday

St. Luke 19:28-44

[28] When he had said these things, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. [29] When he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent two of the disciples, [30] saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat. Untie it and bring it here. [31] If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say this: 'The Lord has need of it.'" [32] So those who were sent went away and found it just as he had told them. [33] And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 





The Word of God teaches that the bread and wine of the Sacrament are the true Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. This precious gift of God's grace is to be received in a sense of reverent awe after careful self-examination. The Bible defines that self-examination as a personal recognition of the real presence of Christ's Body and Blood in the Sacrament, and a repentant acknowledgment of my own sinfulness recognizing my absolute dependence upon Christ as the only source of forgiveness for my sin. Scripture further instructs that our participation in Christ's Body and Blood together is the most profound and powerful way for Christians to acknowledge their unity in the faith. That is to say, when we share in the Body and Blood of Jesus at this altar, we are thereby indicating our common commitment to all of the doctrines of God's Word as they are taught in this congregation. 
