Isaiah 35:4-7a


[4] Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." [5] Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; [6] then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. Isaiah was sure that Israel's God would not be silent and let his people suffer forever. In sharing this vision, the prophet brought light and hope not only to his contemporaries but also to our generation which also has its share of blind, deaf, lame, speechless, and desert places that long for the water of life – who have tasted the goodness of the Lord and now await the full consummation.

Epistle Reading

James 2:1-10, 14-18

[1] My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. [2] For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, [3] and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, "You sit here in a good place," while you say to the poor man, "You stand over there," or, "Sit down at my feet," [4] have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? [5] Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which he has promised to those who love him? [6] But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you

It was a temptation for James' contemporaries (as it is for us) to be overly impressed with status, wealth and power, and to be disdainful of poverty. James reminds Christians that God chose the poor to be the backbone of the Christian movement. They were among the first to listen and to follow, the first to see who Jesus was and what he really means. They are our teachers, not the powerful.

Christ has opened our ears to the voice of the Father. He releases our tongue to praise him. Truly he has done all things well, and we do well "the more zealously" to proclaim it.

The Word of God teaches that the bread and wine of the Sacrament are the true Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. This precious gift of God's grace is to be received in a sense of reverent awe after careful self-examination. The Bible defines that self-examination as a personal recognition of the real presence of Christ's Body and Blood in the Sacrament, and a repentant acknowledgment of my own sinfulness recognizing my absolute dependence upon Christ as the only source of forgiveness for my sin. Scripture further instructs that our participation in Christ's Body and Blood together is the most profound and powerful way for Christians to acknowledge their unity in the faith. That is to say, when we share in the Body and Blood of Jesus at this altar, we are thereby indicating our common commitment to all of the doctrines of God's Word as they are taught in this congregation. Because of these Biblical convictions, we respectfully request that visitors, who wish to join us in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ and thereby identify with our confession of Bible truth, speak with one of our pastors before attending the Lord's Supper.

WITNESSING... WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT? Do you feel like you want to share Christ with others but don't know how? Then join Pastor Krieg as he guides you through the *Every One His Witness* Lutheran evangelism program. This program puts sound doctrine into practical action for sharing the faith with people in our everyday lives. You will learn: What is witnessing? Why do we witness? And the "how-to" of witnessing using the LASSIE approach — Listen-Ask-Seek-Share-Invite-Encourage. Taking this class does not obligate you to be on the Evangelism committee, it simply helps equip you to share the love of Christ with all those He places in your life. There is no door-to-door or cold-calling people, this is a different approach, yet still intentional. Bring a friend or family member and learn together. (Led by Pastor Krieg)

COMMUNITY – WE ARE NOT ALONE (Concordia Publishing House) – This is an easy and inspiriting class for women that requires no weekly reading and no homework. Just show up and join us as we discuss Lutheran spirituality. "Today, many people feel that no organized religion empowers them to be healthy, renewed, or growing human beings - or even Christians! To them, rituals and organizations found in churches are mere empty shells. This [series] will expound a Lutheran conviction that we do have abundant life given in the Church." Jesus says: "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." (John 10:10) Have you ever heard someone say, "I'm a spiritual person, but I'm not religious"? Using the Bible, Luther's Catechism, and the Lutheran hymnal, Pastor Masaki shows us that joy "is found in the Lord's Church alone and the life that is lived there together as Christians in community."
