
Epistle Reading

Hebrews 4:1-16

[1] Therefore, while the promise of entering his rest still stands, let us fear lest any of you should seem to have failed to reach it. [2] For good news came to us just as to them, but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened. [3] For we who have believed enter that rest, as he has said, "As I swore in my wrath, 'They shall not enter my rest," although his works were finished from the foundation of the world. [4] For he has somewhere spoken of the seventh day in this way: "And God rested on the seventh day from all his works." [5] And again in this passage he said, "They shall not enter my rest." [6] Since therefore it remains for some to enter it,

There is a "rest" for God's people – a time and place of peace, free of all danger. But entering that rest requires inner struggle with all manner of outward temptation and conflict. Jesus, who has experienced it all and who overcame, helps in our time of need. He is the refuge that protects and strengthens us.

[16] Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Scripture further instructs that our participation in Christ's Body and Blood together is the most profound and powerful way for Christians to acknowledge their unity in the faith. That is to say, when we share in the Body and Blood of Jesus at this altar, we are thereby indicating our common commitment to all of the doctrines of God's Word as they are taught in this congregation. 
