Forbidden Love – 1 John 2:15-17 Update on CCO . . .

## Read vs • Forbidden Love

- 1. The title of today's message sounds like it's drawn from the new genre of Amish Romance novels.
  - a. Forbidden Love, 3<sup>rd</sup> book of the 7-part series Love in the Hinterlands by Beverly Lewis.
  - b. Pick up a hardcopy or download to your e-reader today
  - c. And follow Amish maiden Siobaughn as she wrestles with her competing desires for outsider Max & loyalty to her community.
- 2. The forbidden love we're looking at today is a bit different.
- 3. It's a <u>fierce contest</u> every one of us is called to enter.
  - a. There isn't a person *here*, at our CI & SP campuses, or the sound of my voice that doesn't need to be reminded of what John pens here.
  - b. Our struggles are **different** in the specifics of **HOW** we'll apply this.
  - c. But all of us fight the same battle with the World
  - d. The only difference is HOW that World takes shape for us & competes for our affection.
- 4. Before we dive in, let's remember John's overall theme in 1 John
  - a. Everything he writes about deals with our relationships –
  - b. First w/God, then w/1 another.
- 5. What he says here gets right to the *heart* / core of our relationship w/God from which all *other* relationships flow.

V. 15

- <sup>15</sup> Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
- 1. 2 loves are presented: A Love of the World & The Love of God.
- 2. John says they're mutually-exclusive.
  - a. If we love the world, we *can't* love God.
  - b. And if we love God, we **won** 't love the world.
- 3. To which some might say, "Wait! Does John 3:16 says that God so loved the WORLD, He gave His Son?" Indeed it does.
  - a. The same John wrote **both** that & **this**. //But he means something **different** here.
  - b. In the NT, the word "world" is used in 3 ways.
    - 1) There's the **physical planet** we call Earth. (Acts 17:24)
    - 2) Then there's **world of people** we refer to as humanity. That's what Jesus spoke of in John 3:16 that God loves.
    - 3) The 3<sup>rd</sup> flavor of the word "world," the 1 John means here, is the corrupt world system in rebellion against God.

- a) The Ap Paul says the devil is the "god" (little 'g') of **THAT** world. (2 Cor 4:4)
- 5. That world began in Eden when Adam & Eve chose to sin at satan's prompting.
  - a. Up to that point, they'd loved, served, & obeyed God. The result was *Life*

Complete Satisfaction & &

unrestrained Joy.

- b. But the devil floated the idea that they were missing out on something MORE!
- c. He planted the idea there was **another** way to live; one that was **better** because it was **independent** from God.
  - 1) As with **all** his deceits, there was a tiny bit of truth in what he said. But it was mis-applied.
  - 2) There WAS another way for Adam & Even to live.
  - 3) Problem is, they had to forfeit the Satisfaction & Joy obeying God gave them.
  - 4) So, they reached for the different way the devil offered & lost the life they had.
  - 5) In its place they were given frustration & sorrow because that's what's left when you give up the Life God created you for.
- 6. From that day to this, all of Adam & Eve's kids; what we call "the human race" has ratified the choice they made by *continuing to believe* the lie that we can *live independently* of God.
- 7. This is STILL the lie satan promotes. He promotes it **through** the world-system.
- 8. Just in case there's someone here who doesn't believe the Bible calls the devil the god or ruler of this world, let me just do a quick review of a few passages.
  - a. **Matt**  $4 3^{\text{rd}}$  Temptation: Devil took Jesus up on a high mountain & showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.
    - 1) Said it would all be his if He just worshiped him.
    - 2) Only way that temptation would be real is if devil had power to do it.
  - b. 3 times in *Gspl Jhn*, Jesus called satan = "the *ruler of this world*." 12:31/14:30/16:11
  - c. In 2 Cor. 4:4 Paul calls him the "god of this age."
  - d. In **Eph 2:2**, Paul calls the devil the "prince of the power of the air, who works in & thru the lost."
- 9. Just as God works *thru* believers by *Holy* Spirit, the unholy spirit of satan works thru the lost to accomplish *his* purposes.
- 10. A bit later in 1 John 5:19 John says

We know that we are of God, & the whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one.

- 11. The "world" John means here is the **system** by which fallen people, under the inspiration of satan & his **minions** the demons, seeks to <u>live & identify</u> themselves **apart** from God.
- 12. Think of it this way: We refer to "the world of sports / finance; the fashion-world.
  - a. The world of politics, business-world, world of entertainment.
  - b. Put all that together & you have **THE** World
  - c. The corporate, united expression of man's rejection of God.
  - d. Now, that's not to say *every aspect* of all these different realms is wicked or evil.
    - 1) The high-jump & pole-vaulting aren't inherently sinful.
    - 2) Denim & plaid aren't wicked.
    - 3) Stocks & bonds aren't evil.
  - e. What makes all these different aspects of human society evil is when they are used as the means to assert mankind's independence from God.
  - f. When people **use them** to gain power, glory, satisfaction & joy **apart from** their identity **in** & relationship **with** God.
  - g. And let's face it: THAT'S what the whole system aims to do!
- 13. The World has its own rules & values that have little to nothing to do with God.
- 14. To **succeed** in the world, you have to **go along to get along**.
- 15. John is crystal in v15: We're not to love *that* world/ system.
  - a. The born again are to make a *clean break* w/it.
  - b. That world is in *opposition* to God, but we have been *reconciled* to Him.
  - c. We can't be loyal to **both** God & the world because they call us to mutually exclusive priorities & values.
- 16. Jesus said it this way in Matt 6:24

"No 1 can serve 2 masters; for either he will hate the 1 and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the 1 and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

- a. Today, "mammon" is synonymous w/money. // It meant a lot more in Jesus' day
- b. It referred to *materialism*;
  - 1) The idea that the **bottom line of life** was to live it up in the here & now.
  - 2) And the surest way to do that was to get as much money & power as you could.
  - 3) Never be in need, because you always have the means to get what you want.
  - 4) That's mammon Materialism; The one who dies w/the most toys wins.
  - 5) Really, mammon was the world's MO.
- 17. Jesus said God & the World are 2 masters who place competing & mutually exclusive demands on us.
  - a. To obey 1 is to defy the other.
  - b. Jesus says we have to *chose* who to obey, because it *can't* be both. // It's God or the World.

## 18. John *echoes* that here.

Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

- a. John's not saying we can't enjoy *creation*; the Planet.
- b. On the contrary, in 1 Tim 6:17, Paul says God's given us an abundance of all these things to enjoy.
- c. and John certainly wouldn't ban the love of people because we ought to love what God loves, & we know He loves all, even the lost.
- d. what John prohibits is a love of & devotion to the world-system that hates & opposes God.

## More Love

- 1. Vs16-17 elaborate on the challenge the world presents to our affection for God.
- 2. We'll dive deeply into that this Wednesday.
- 3. But there's something suggested by what John says in v15 we need to look at.
- 4. Because we're created in God's image, we have the capacity to *love*.
  - a. More than capacity, we have the NEED to love.
  - b. The question isn't **IF** we love, only **WHAT** // Everyone loves something or someone.
  - c. And by love, I mean the deep longing of the soul to **be with** what's loved.
    - 1) To yearn for it to be benefited & blessed.
- 5. Now, it's the nature of such love that it can *only be given to one*.
  - a. When you were conceived, God placed a spirit in you.
  - b. With that spirit, God gave you a singular & unique gift, the ability to love.
  - c. It's your great potential to give that gift to something or someone.
- 6. When God created Adam, His intention was that Adam would give his love to Him.
  - a. As Adam loved God, God returned that love & enlarged it so it could be poured out on Eve & their home in Eden.
  - b. But the day came when Adam turned his love from God to himself in a bid for a different way of living.
  - c. And all of history since is the long, sad tale of man's attempt to fashion something worthy of his love, something that will **return** his love, but without success.
- 7. [Story of the Key]
  - a. After his HS graduation, a young man's very wealthy father handed him a wrapped box.
  - b. Instead of opening it, he tucked it under his arm, said thank you but begged off further conversation because his friends were headed out to celebrate.
  - c. He climbed into the back seat of a friend's car and as they drove away, tore the wrapping off the box and opened it to find a single, oddly shaped key. No note or explanation; just the key.
  - d. He put it in his pocket, intending to ask his dad later what it was for.
  - e. Arriving home late that night, his parents already asleep, he took the key out of his pocket and put it in a drawer.
  - f. And forgot about it.
  - g. Months went by, then a couple years & his father died.
  - h. As he packed to move, he discovered the key & realized he'd never asked his dad what it was for.
  - i. He slipped it on his key-ring as a reminder of his father.
  - j. Every lock he came to he tried the key to see if it fit; but of course it didn't.

- k. A few more years went by when it dawned on him his mother might know what the key was for. He asked her.
- 1. She went to a bookcase in the den & pulled out one of her husband's favorite books.
- m. Opening the front cover she withdrew an envelope with the son's name on it.
- n. As she handed it to him & said, "Your dad gave me this not long before he died. He said if you ever asked me what that key was for, I was to give you this. He waited for you to ask him, but you never did. I hope this answers your questions."
- o. With regret, he carefully opened it & took out a single sheet with his dad's handwriting on it. Dear Mark, The key I gave you at your HS graduation opens a safe-deposit box at the bank. Inside, you'll find a whole book of pre-signed checks.

I love you son and I'm proud to be your father. // Love Dad.

At the bottom was the address for bank and # of the box.

- 8. That key, so long **neglected**, then **mis-used** in trying to open the **wrong** doors, was the means by which so much more could be accomplished.
- 9. It's the same with us and our ability/capacity to love.
  - a. God's given us a gift, a key, if you will.
  - b. If we give our love to the world, it'll be wasted.
  - c. But if we give it to God, then He opens to us a treasure-house of more love that floods us with the ability to love others Which is EXACTLY what John goes on to say.
- 10. If we love the world, we'll find our love consumed & wasted.
- 11. When we love God, He pours it back to us a hundred-fold.
