# Luke Series #9 "The Joy of Repentance" - Luke 15:1-10

## I. INTRODUCTION

#### A. Child & Vase

- 1. A boy got his hand caught inside an expensive vase
- 2. Parents tried everything to get it out
  - a. soap and water
  - b. vaseline
  - c. Dad even sprayed some WD-40 in there
- 3. Nothing worked
- 4. Right at point of breaking vase
- 5. Mother very upset because it was a family heirloom
- 6. Just as Dad was about to bring down the hammer, the boy asked, "Would it help if I let go of the penny I'm holding?"

# B. Repentance

- 1. Many people do not come to Christ because they are holding on to their sin
- 2. They won't let go, even though they know it may cost them heaven
- 3. Repentance means letting go of our sin so that we can embrace Christ with both hands
- 4. Our text today talks about the importance of repentance

### II. TEXT

#### A. Vs. 1-2

- 1 Then all the tax collectors and the sinners drew near to Him to hear Him. 2 And the Pharisees and scribes complained, saying, "This Man receives sinners and eats with them."
  - 1. 14:25 tells us that as Jesus was making his way toward Jerusalem, He had attracted huge crowds
    - a. and the people could be roughly divided into two groups
    - b. those who supported Him, and those who opposed Him
    - c. those who supported Him were the common people
      - · specially the downtrodden and social outcasts
      - · Jesus showed special love and care for them
    - d. those who opposed Him were the religious leaders
      - they were the spiritually elite
      - · looked down on the common people as beneath their dignity
      - · so when they see Jesus fraternizing with them, they become

- indignant
- they especially thought it scandalous that Jesus would eat with sinners
- in their mind, to share a meal was the most intimate kind of friendship
- so of course, it really bugged them that Jesus, a man so obviously empowered by God, would dirty Himself with people they deemed so unworthy
- 2. Jesus knew their thoughts and heard their criticisms

#### B. Vs. 3-10

- 3 So He spoke this parable to them, saying:
- 4 "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he loses one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness, and go after the one which is lost until he finds it?
- 5 "And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing.
- 6 "And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!'
- 7 "I say to you that likewise there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.
- 8 "Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it?
- 9 "And when she has found it, she calls her friends and neighbors together, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the piece which I lost!'
- 10 "Likewise, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."
  - 1. Jesus tells two parables to try to get across to the people just how much God yearns for the lost to be saved
  - 2. In the first, a shepherd has a flock of a hundred sheep
    - a. during day, has taken them out to pasture
    - b. but in evening, has returned them to the sheepfold
    - c. as they pass under his rod into the fold, he counts them off; 96, 97, 98, 99
    - d. one is missing
    - e. so he immediately goes out to search for the lost sheep
      - · it might be hurt
      - · if he doesn't find it soon, it will certainly be in danger
    - f. so there is an urgency to the shepherd's search
    - g. he calls out, making his distinctive shepherd's call, hoping to hear

- the lost sheep's answering baa
- h. he looks here and there, going back over every place the flock went that day
- i. and finally, after a weary search, he finds the lost sheep
- j. his joy is complete, for what was lost, is now found
- 3. In the second parable, a woman has lost a precious coin
  - a. she has nine others, but they are secure so she doesn't worry about them
  - b. it is the lost coin that occupies her attention
  - c. she turns her house upside down in the search
  - d. and finally finds it, tucked away in some overlooked cranny
  - e. as with the shepherd, her joy at recovering the coin is complete
  - f. she calls her friends and tells them the good news!
  - g. the coin is back where it belongs!
- 4. Jesus tells the people that these two parables are a picture of heaven
  - a. God is like the shepherd who is going after lost men and women
  - b. He is like the woman who searches high and low for the lost coin
  - c. when the lost is found, He rejoices
- 5. But Jesus says that it is when sinners repent that the heavens break forth in celebration
- 6. What's the connection between finding the lost and repentance?
- 7. Notice something about <u>both</u> these parables
  - a. in both of them, something precious was lost
  - b. for a shepherd each and every sheep is as precious as a child
  - c. the woman lost a coin which to her was precious
  - d. it was *because* of the preciousness of these lost things that the two of them were so diligent in seeking to recover them
  - e. the point is this: we are precious to God!
    - · He values us so much that He sent His Son to seek us
    - all the religions of the world are the story of man's attempt to reach up to a distant God
    - Christianity is utterly different because it is the story of a loving God reaching down to seek and save indifferent lost people
  - f. friend = you are precious to God!
- 8. And though we are of great value to God, from His perspective, men and women are lost in sin
  - a. Isa 53:6 "All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way."
  - b. Jesus came, as the Good Shepherd, to turn us from our own way, back to God
  - c. and that, in essence is what repentance is
    - · to turn around

- to turn from our own way, the way of sin, and turn TO God
- d. Rom 2:4 "Do you despise the riches of His goodness, forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?"

### C. The Point

- 1. Jesus is making a point with these parables
- 2. The Pharisees were critical of Jesus for the company He kept
  - a. he hung out with shady folk
  - b. people with a poor reputation
- 3. Jesus rebukes them for not realizing why He showed such love and grace to these people
  - a. they were the poor lost sinners
  - b. God was seeking them
  - c. and because they were seeing the love and mercy of God in Jesus, they were coming to repentance
  - d. the angels were celebrating and all heaven was a party because of the large number of sinners who were repenting
- 4. The rebuke to the Pharisees was that they were all sour and upset when they should have been rejoicing too
- 5. There is a very real danger that we face as committed Christians
  - a. it's the danger of becoming so ingrown and comfortable with each other that we stop reaching out to the lost
  - b. we get in to our holy huddle
  - c. and the only time we ever look out is kind of over our shoulder at that wicked world out there that is going to hell, and good riddance!
- 6. Let us never forget that God loves the world
  - a. He loves the lost
  - b. they are precious to Him beyond comprehension
  - c. and we are the ones who have been given the message of love and repentance

## III. CONCLUSION

- A. An Important Message
- 1. This is an important message for us at this time
- 2. We continue to grow!
- 3. Seeing more and more people who don't know the Lord coming to our services
- 4. When they come in, sometimes . . .
  - a. dressed strangely
  - b. look a bit different
  - c. maybe even smell a bit
- 5. Rejoice that God has brought them to hear of His love

- 6. Pray for their salvation
- 7. Ask God to add them to His people
- 8. And get excited when you see them respond to the gospel!
- 9. Good grief = the angels are celebrating why don't we?
- 10. We will soon be moving to a new area of the City that desperately needs a work of God
  - a. our opportunities there will be tremendous
- 11. Both for here and there, we need a sense of expectancy that God is going to save men and women and children
- 12. We need to have a sense of expectancy that God is going to set people free from sin, that they will repent of their sin
  - a. delivered from drugs, booze, perversion
- 13. And we need to be praying that it will happen in our church, home, job.
