Hold Fast – Revelation 2:18-29

Read Rev 2:18-29 • Progression

- 1. The 7 Churches Jesus sent letters to in chs. 2&3, all lie on the main highway that serves this region in Western Asia Minor; the modern nation of Turkey.
- 2. That highway makes a circuit; an oval covering a couple hundred miles.
- 3. Ephesus, the first church, was THE major port & where all mail headed for that region would first arrive.
- 4. Then it would be taken by a postal carrier to each of the cities in the order given here.
- 5. So it makes sense Jesus dictated these letter in this order.
- 6. But for many years, careful Bible students have noticed that the message to the 7 churches, a specifically, their *order*, has an eerie resemblance to Church History.
- 7. Watch this . . .
 - a. The First Church is Ephesus.
 - 1) You remember Jesus *commended* them for being busy, faithful, pure, & doctrinally sound.
 - 2) But they'd left their first love; a passion for Jesus.
 - 3) That well describes the Church right after the Apostles.
 - 4) Persecution hadn't set in yet as the official policy of the Roman Empire.
 - 5) So the Church grew rapidly, but as it worked on getting organized, it lost the fire that fueled its first days.
 - b. Next was **Smyrna**, the persecuted church.
 - 1) Jesus warned them they'd have 10 days of trial.
 - 2) And indeed, there were 10 episodes of *official* persecution before it was lifted by the Emperor Constantine.
 - c. Third was the Church at Pergamos we looked at 2 weeks ago.
 - 1) While Jesus commended their past loyalty, He docks them for allowing false teachers to encourage compromise with the world.
 - 2) That well captures the essence of what happened WITH Constantine's acceptance of the Faith.
 - 3) The Church suddenly found itself not just *free* of persecution, but *favored* by those in power.
 - 4) And in a short time the official religion of the Empire.
- 8. The progression is reflected in the *names* of these cities.
 - a. **Ephesus** = **Darling** & fits Jesus' call for them to return to Him, their first love.
 - b. **Smyrna** comes from the word **myrrh**;
 - 1) A perfuming spice most often used in embalming.
 - 2) Fitting for a church getting hammered by persecution.
 - 3) Precious in the Lord's sight is the death of His saints. [Ps. 116:15]
 - c. Then **Pergamos** which means "thru marriage"
 - 1) The false teachers advocated that very thing.
 - 2) That Christians should "go along to get along" & embrace the culture.
 - 3) Jesus reminds them they're betrothed to Him & cannot compromise with the world.
- 9. That brings us to the 4th church at *Thyatira*.
 - a. This is a church that **did not heed** the warning against compromise.
 - b. And that camel's nose allowed in the tent has turned into the whole flea-infested beast now inside.

V18

And to the angel of the church in Thyatira write, "These things says the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, & His feet like fine brass:

- 1. The smallest & least important of the 7 cities gets the longest letter.
- 2. Thyatira was 40 miles SE of Pergamos along that circular highway that ran thru Western Asia Minor.
- 3. Because it lay on an important route that saw a lot of traffic, Thyatira did well as a center of manufacturing.
- 4. Archaeology of the site reveals it was an industrial center.
 - a. It had a lot of bakers, shoe-makers, tanners, weavers, & potters.
 - b. It's <u>chief industry</u> was **brass**. They made a **special kind** of brass there that was light in color & almost looked like silver; it was called **fine**-brass.
 - c. Thyatira was also famous for a purple dye much sought after in the ancient world.
 - 1) In Acts 16 while in Philippi, Paul led a woman named *Lydia* to faith in Christ.

- 2) She was a dye-merchant from Thyatira on a business trip in Philippi.
- 3) It's likely when she returned to her hometown, she carried the Gospel with her and helped to start the church there.
- 5. It's Thyatira's *economy* that presented the biggest challenge to the Church.
 - a. Remember the guilds we talked about 2 weeks ago in Pergamos
 - b. Archaeology tells us they DOMINATED of life in Thyatira.
 - c. They were a kind of ancient labor union that controlled who worked.
 - 1) Each guild had its own patron god or goddess.
 - 2) Their meetings, held a couple times a year, were conducted in a pagan temple where guild members ate a ceremonial meal in which the food had been dedicated to an idol –
 - 3) And they were entertained by ritual prostitutes; both male and female.
 - d. It was this idolatry & immorality Christians couldn't participate in.
 - e. So they quit the guilds & lost their jobs.
- 6. Think of Thyatira as a *factory* town; an industrial center.

Because of the guilds, it was also a *Union Town*.

- 7. Remember how in the earlier letters Jesus was so **personal** with them?
 - a. He wanted them to know, He knows them & where they live.
 - b. So He mentions specific details of their city & things that had happened in their church.
 - c. He does that here with the Church at Thyatira.
- 8. One of the major components of ancient industry was *fire*; same as today.
 - a. Fire was used to bake, to boil, melt, & purify.
 - b. As you walked around Thyatira, you saw *a lot* of fire.
- 9. So, Jesus describes Himself as the One's whose eyes are a flame of fire.
 - a. His vision pierces; He sees all, even what's in our hearts.
 - b. He not only sees WHAT'S done; He knows **WHY**.
 - c. "The dog ate my homework" won't fly when we stand before God's Judgment.
- 10. But if there was one thing Thyatira was KNOWN for; it was their unique brand of ultra-fine brass.
 - a. So, Jesus tells them, again drawing form the vision John had of Him in His glory in ch. 1, that His feet are made of fine-brass.
 - b. He's taken a stand and He's not budging!

V19

"I know your works, love, service, faith, & your patience; & as for your works, the last are more than the first.

- 1. Like Ephesus, they busy, faithful & patient.
- 2. *Unlike* Ephesus, they'd *maintained their love*.
- 3. What makes Jesus' commendation of the church at Thyatira **stand out** is their **growth** in these things. He says their **recent** works are **more** than before.
 - a. They didn't just get off to a good start, then fizzle as so many do.
 - b. They'd ramped it up over time so that when Jesus sent this, they were doing more than ever.
- 4. Their glory days weren't in their past; They were *in* them; *living* them.
- 5. Christian: If Jesus wrote you a letter, what would He *commend*?
 - a. Would He give kudos for How it **USED** to be?
 - 1) How your love for Him meant pouring over His Word w/journal next to it; jotting down insights He gave.
 - 2) Sharing the Gospel with people you met.
 - 3) Wishing there were MORE services at church you could go to, instead of finding reasons why you CAN'T make it.
 - b. Are the Glory Days of your walk with Jesus in the review mirror or are you IN them now?
 - c. By God's grace THESE can be; ought to be the BEST days; the most blessed days of your life.
 - d. Not EASIEST- But certainly Best.
 - e. Because as time goes by, our knowledge & experience of Jesus ought to grow, enlarge, expand.
 - f. And **All that** combines to make us more effective in the hand & purposes of God.
- 6. Though the Church at Thyatira comes in for this wonderful commendation, it doesn't apply to everyone.
 - a. There are those who are part of the visible church, who aren't part of the Body of Christ.

They are members of the Church but not Jesus.

Vs20-23

- ²⁰ Nevertheless I have a few things against you, because you allow that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality and eat things sacrificed to idols.
- ²¹ And I gave her time to repent of her sexual immorality, and she did not repent. ²² Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their deeds. ²³ I will kill her children with death, and all the churches shall know that I am He who searches the minds and hearts. And I will give to each one of you according to your works.
- 1. Here's the sitch . . .
 - a. There was a false teacher in the Church at Thyatira who'd been given a prominent role in the work there.
 - b. She *promoted* the very things Jesus *condemned* in the Church at Pergamos.
- 2. Look at v14 –

But I have a few things against you, because <u>you have there</u> those who hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols, and to commit sexual immorality.

- a. The problem in Pergamos was that there were people in the Church who *held* these goofy ideas & the pastor & people hadn't confronted them; calling them to *repent or leave*.
- b. Now in Thyatira, there weren't just people who *held* these beliefs,
- c. One of the leaders TAUGHT them from a position of some authority.
- d. We see that in the words of v20 when Jesus says
- ... you allow that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants
 - e. That word "allow' means = To give over to; Tolerate; Give permission.
- 3. There was a woman of influence who'd **been given** a position of authority that set policy for the fellowship.
 - a. She claimed to be a prophetess & that what she taught was the Word & Will of God.
 - b. The false teaching *troubling* Pergamos has become *policy* at Thyatira.
- 5. This is what ALWAYS happens when we **allow** moral compromise.
 - a. The compromis-<u>ING</u> become the compromis-<u>ED</u>
- 6. Jesus' evaluation of this woman is harsh. He calls her "Jezebel."
 - a. A name dripping with connotations of evil.
 - b. This would be like calling someone Hitler or Stalin.
- 7. Jezebel was the daughter of the King of Sidon. She married Israel's King Ahab.
 - a. She brought with her the worship of Baal, the main Phoenician god.
 - b. Not content to just **add** Baal to the worship of the God of Israel, she set out to wipe out the Faith.
 - c. Her contest with the Prophet Elijah are some of the most dramatic in all the Bible.
- 8. Jesus dips back into history and picks a figure this woman in the Church at Thyatira was like.
 - a. SHE claimed to be a prophetess and a bunch of people believed it.
 - b. Jesus says, "She may be a prophetess, but NOT MINE! She doesn't speak for Me."
 - c. "In fact, WHAT she's teaching I reject!"
- 9. Then in vs. 21-23, Jesus says He's already convicted her & urged her to repent.
 - a. She's chosen instead to be intransigent.
 - b. She dug in her heels and doubled-down on her heresy KNOWING it was wrong!
- 10. So, Jesus says He's going to bring a season of sickness on her.
 - a. And all those who bought her lies, & refuse to repent, will perish.
 - b. But hope is held out for those who come to their senses and turn form their error
- ²² Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, <u>unless</u> they repent of their deeds.
- 11. In the midst of all this judgment, Jesus' mercy holds open the door to forgiveness:

If people will just repent.

- 12. The point of correction for the Church was that **they** d given this false teacher a platform.
- 13. How could the pastor have allowed this?

- 14. We can only speculate; but it's good to do so, because any one of these speculations is a warning for us to be on the lookout for.
 - a. It's possible the pastor *didn't recognize* what she taught as error.

Remedy: Pastors need to be men of God's Word because they are to **feed** God's flock.

b. Maybe he lacked *courage*.

Remedy: Pastors need spine. They're called to **protect** the flock of God.

c. This woman may have been a powerful person of influence w/a *large following* & many supporters.

<u>Remedy</u>: Pastors are also called to *lead* w/confidence & certainty & not let others rip off those God entrusts to their care.

- 15. Want to share a little story.
 - a. Several years ago, a guy planned to move into our area & start a church.
 - b. He's charismatic & has a lot of devoted supporters.
 - c. But he also has a well-earned rep as a womanizer.
 - d. He left where he was because of **scandal** & want to move here to get away from it.
 - e. But there was no repentance only denial.
 - f. I was asked to join a small group of local pastors to evaluate all the evidence & decide what to do.
 - g. We met w/him & he refused to repent, though it was obvious he was a serial adulterer.
 - h. So we informed him if he started a church, we'd make a public statement of our opposition.
 - i. He decided to pull the plug on his plans.
 - j. But, & here's the hard part > Several of his local fan-club went ballistic!
 - 1) I mean; they were maaaad! Just furious.
 - 2) They called me names & accused me of some really nasty stuff.
 - k. They knew what he'd done, but didn't care because they liked him & the goofy things he taught.
 - 1. His teaching gave them permission to do what *they* wanted to do—all in the Name of God.
- 16. Who doesn't want to be liked? I do.
 - a. But I'm not here to build a fan-club.
 - b. I have a holy assignment as a pastor:

To Lead, Feed, & Protect this Flock God's assigned to me & me to.

- c. I pray every day for the Knowledge, Wisdom, Courage & Skill to do that.
- 17. You need to know there will be times when I have to warn you about some Jezebel who's written a book, has a TV or radio program, is holding mass rallies with thousands of enthusiastic supporters claiming she's the greatest thing since Al Gore invented the interwebs.
- 18. And that may, just might, tick some of you off because you like her & realize neither the root nor result of the error she's spewing.
- 19. Please remember this moment & Jesus' message to the Church at Thyatira.
- 20. I ache to see you safely through the Gate of Heaven.
- 21. Not cast into great tribulation, nor slain by the error of heresy.

Vs24-25

"Now to you I say, and to the rest in Thyatira, as many as <u>do not have</u> this doctrine, who have not known the depths of Satan, as <u>they</u> say, I will put on you no other burden.

- 1. That phrase, "depths of satan" tips us off to what this false prophetess taught.
- 2. For time's sake, we need to cover this quickly . . .
 - a. This was something a pseudo-Christian cult called the **Gnostics** said.
 - b. In a nutshell they said the body was doomed to sin & could not be holy.
 - c. The spirit, on the other hand, was holy & could not be stained by sin.
 - d. So; they concluded: God is only concerned about the spirit, so go ahead & do whatever you wanted with your body.
 - 1) Eat idol-dedicated meat. Engage in whatever sex you want.
 - 2) In fact: Immerse your BODY in sin, plunge it into the depths of satan,
 - 3) So in the midst of it, you can realize how your spiritual is still holy.
- 3. Hey: It's all about God's glory, right?
 - a. Well, we glorify God because He gives us grace.

- b. And where sin abounds, grace super-abounds.
- c. So when we sin more, God gets more glory.
- d. In Rom. 3, Paul says false teachers actually accused him of teaching this.
- 4. Here Jesus dispatches all such silliness by commending those who reject it.
- 5. You & I are called to holiness as we follow Jesus.
- 6. The message to Pergamos is repeated and emphasized here.
- 7. Don't **start** down the path of moral compromise.
 - a. Remember: The compromising become the compromised & corrupt.
 - b. Don't ask what you can do & still be a Christian; still make it to heaven.
 - c. Chose instead to walk faithfully with Jesus and be holy.
 - d. Steer clear of sin; don't play chicken with it.
- ²⁵ But hold fast what you have till I come.
- 8. Hold on to Jesus!

Vs26-28

- ²⁶ And he who overcomes, and keeps My works until the end, to him I will give power over the nations—²⁷ '*He shall rule them with a rod of iron;* They shall be dashed to pieces like the potter's vessels'—as I also have received from My Father; ²⁸ and I will give him the morning star.
- 1. Jezebel's message had traction in Thyatira because of the guilds that controlled life there.
- 2. You gotta' go along to get along.
- 3. The faithful had chosen **not** to go along with the world & suffered for it.
- 4. Jesus calls them to hold fast to Him, because a great reversal is coming.
- 5. Those who've been despised & persecuted will be greatly honored & abundantly rewarded.
- 6. The Meek shall inherit the Earth. / Those who mourn will be comforted.
- 7. Those who've suffered at the hands of an unjust system will rule in righteousness.
- 8. Jesus will give the morning star to those who hold on to Him.
 - a. Take all the gems & jewels in all the crowns & scepters; all the brooches, rings & necklaces worn by kings & queens, emperors & empresses thru all history.
 - b. They are worthless baubles compared to the treasure Jesus has for us = Himself.
 - c. He **IS** the Morning Star [Rev. 22:16]

V29

He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

Progression Reprise . . .

- 1. We began by noting the interesting similarity between the churches of Revelation and Church History.
- 2. Ephesus looks like the Early Church from just after the Apostles until persecution.
- 3. Smyrna well captures the persecuted church, & Pergamos the church that was tempted to buddy up to the World when Constantine lifted persecution.
- 4. Thyatira represents the next era of Church History; the *Holy Roman Empire*.
 - a. This was a time when the compromis**ing** church of Constantine's time became the Compromis**ed** & Corrupt church of the Middle Ages.
 - b. Idolatry & Immorality was rampant.
 - c. The name Thyatira means, "Ongoing Sacrifice" & points to the **Mass**, the center of the Medieval Church's theology and practice.
- 5. Now, please don't jump to the conclusion I'm piling on the Roman Catholic Church.
- 6. We're just considering the parallels between these letters and history.
- 7. If Thyatira applies to the Catholic Church of the Middle Ages, then the next church, Sardis, is the Protestant Church of the Reformation. Wait till we take a look at that next week. It's not what we might expect.
