INTRODUCTION • Read vs.

Made Man

- 1. As used today, the term "made-man" refers to a wiseguy whose devotion to organized crime has earned him a permanent place in the organization.
- 2. But the term "made-man" *originally* referred to someone whose success in life was assured.
 - a. Made-men & -women were those who by birth or relationship were ensured special privilege.
- 3. If you're a Christian, a born-again follower of Jesus You're Made!
- 4. We see that in our text today.

Recap

- 1. We pick it up were we left off last week.
- 2. The Apostle John has a vision of God's throne in heaven.
 - a. In His right hand is a scroll; the title deed to Earth.
 - b. Jesus, as a sacrificial lamb, takes the scroll, & prepares to break its 7-seals as He takes possession of what rightly belongs to Him.

Vs. 8-10

- ⁸ Now when He had taken the scroll, the 4 living creatures & the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb,

- the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, & golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.
- 1. As we read on we find when Jesus takes the scroll, **ALL** heaven breaks out in worship, not just the 24 elders & 4 cherubim.
 - But the elders play a **special** role. As part of their worship, they have **harps** & **bowls**.
 - a. From this comes the idea we'll all get harps in heaven.
 - 1) But it's just the 24 elders who have them.
 - 2) A harp was the **most sophisticated** & **melodious** instrument known in the 1st C.
 - b. The elders also have golden bowls of incense, which John says are the prayers of the saints.
 - 1) And what have the saints been praying for 2000 years?
 - 2) Jesus taught us to pray, "Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on Earth as it is in heaven."
- 3. John sees when Jesus moves to answer *that* prayer, finally & fully!
- 4. He takes the title deed to Earth & comes as *King* to take possession of what belongs to Him.
- 5. I'll never forget the day escrow closed on our house. Lynn & I were so excited.
 - a. Weeks before we signed all the papers & jumped through all the hoops.
 - b. Then the days ticked down till I picked up the keys & the place was ours.
 - c. I don't have the best memory, but I can still see walking up to the front door for the first time as the new owner.
 - d. Walking in & standing in the living room.
- 6. **That's** what we're seeing here.
 - a. Jesus is closing escrow on what He purchased with His blood.
 - b. And all heaven breaks out in celebration.
- ⁹ & they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll, & to open its seals; for You were slain, & have redeemed us to God by Your blood out of every tribe & tongue & people & nation, ¹⁰ & have made us kings & priests to our God; & we shall reign on the earth."
- 7. It's from what they say here we understand the elders as **representatives** of all God's people throughout history.
 - a. They're from every ethnic group, language, & location.
 - b. All who've looked to God in faith, trusting in His mercy & grace.
- 8. It's their song in v10 I want to focus on this morning. They sing -

[You] have made us kings & priests to our God; & we shall reign on the earth.

From – To

1. Last week we considered what Jesus has redeemed us **from**.

- a. Just as the Passover lamb redeemed the Jews from bondage to slavery in Egypt –
- b. Jesus is the Great & Final Passover Lamb who takes away the sins of the world and saves us *from* bondage to sin and death.
- 2. Here in v10, the elders proclaim what we've been redeemed **TO!**

[You] have made us kings & priests to our God.

- 3. We're **royalty** because as the born-again children of God, we're part of His family.
 - a. In Rom 8:17 Paul says we are heirs of God & joint-heirs w/Jesus Christ.
 - b. We partake of His inheritance.
 - c. That's why in Rev. 3:21 Jesus said

To him who overcomes I will grant to sit w/Me on My throne, as I also overcame & sat down w/My Father on His throne.

4. Christian; Hear this You haven't JUST been saved FROM Hell.

You've been saved TO a glorious new destiny as a king or queen.

- 5. There's a recurring theme in story-telling & literature that's captured the imagination of people throughout history.
 - a. It's the story of some usually obscure person, who one day discovers their true identity.
 - b. The Legend of King Arthur is the premier English story.
 - 1) He's the king's son, but whisked away at birth to be raised in secret.
 - 2) His foster brothers treat him poorly, but he learns humility and virtue.
 - 3) Then one day, he withdraws the sword from the stone & proves he is in fact the legitimate king.
 - 4) The truth of his birth become known to all.
 - 5) The lessons he learned in his humble upbringing frame his rule as a good king.
 - b. *Cinderella & Aladdin* are just 2 of the many "rags to riches" tales that have both entertained & inspired millions.
- 6. These stories appeal to us because there's something buried deep inside that knows there's far more to life than just what we see.
 - a. We have an unshakeable sense of **destiny**; a **greatness** that's waiting to emerge.
 - b. It's like we're asleep, waiting for the Prince to come & kiss us back awake.
- 7. I'll tell you why girls love Disney princesses; Anna, Ariel, Jasmine, & Cinderella.
 - a. Why boys of all ages are drawn to Aragorn in Tolkien's classic.
 - b. It's because those stories are really just echoes of who we're created to be.
- 8. And that's WHAT Jesus came to return us to. That's what **Redemption** is all about!
- 9. Last week we saw Jesus take the title deed to Earth from God's hand.
 - a. But Earth isn't really what Jesus is after. It's what Earth holds He wants.
 - b. In Matt. 13, Jesus told a parable of a man who discovered a treasure.
 - 1) He gave everything he had to buy the field that held the treasure.
 - 2) It was the treasure he wanted, not the field.
 - c. In the Book of Ruth, the hero Boaz wanted to marry Ruth.
 - 1) But to do so, he had to redeem a plot of land.
 - 2) At great cost, we bought the land so he could gain a bride.
- 10. All this points to Jesus who became a man & went to the cross to redeem Earth
 - a. Not because He wants land. // He wants a bride.
 - b. **WE** are the treasure in the field He gave everything for.
- 11. And our destiny in redemption is to be kings and queens.
- 12. When Jesus is called the King of kings, it doesn't just refer to the rulers of the nations.
 - a. **WE** are the kings He's <u>THE</u> King over.
- 13. Look at the last part of v10;

And we shall reign on the earth.

- a. We are destined to reign with Christ when He comes again.
- b. Rev. 20 says that we will be the instruments by which Christ's rule during the Millennium is carried out around the world.
- c. Remember Jesus' promise in Rev 2:26

He who overcomes, and keeps My works until the end, to him I will give power over the nations—He shall rule

them with a rod of iron ...

- 14. Realizing our call to reign w/Christ **THEN**, puts a whole new spin on our lives **NOW**.
- 15. This is training to reign.
 - a. In the Legend of King Arthur, it was his humble childhood that groomed him in virtue.
 - b. Moses, Prince of Egypt, had to spend 40 obscure yrs on the backside of the desert tending a flock of sheep to learn how to lead a nation of slaves into their new identity as the people of God.
 - c. You & I are learning how to rule *righteously* & *well* thru the lessons each day brings.
 - d. Our character is shaped by the Spirit as we walk in truth & grace.
 - e. The Word of God renews our minds, the Spirit conforms to the image of Christ.
 - f. YES: We become more like Jesus by learning & living God's Word Because ultimately, we're going to be assigned some territory to rule for His glory.
- 16. How many times have we sat around w/one another & talked about how messed up things are?
 - a. I've read your comments on FB!
 - b. We joke & say, "They just need to put us in charge. We'd straighten everything out."
 - c. It's a joke, but it comes from a deep-seated sense there's something deeply wrong with the world & someone needs to **PUT** it right.
 - d. That day will come. Jesus will come and make things right.
 - 1) What we need to realize is that He's going to make things right THROUGH US!
 - 2) His reign as King of kings will be accomplished *through* us.
 - e. Jesus is the True King Arthur & the Golden Age of Camelot is no mere legend; it will come in the Millennium.
 - f. We are the Knights of His Roundtable; & this life is the School of the Spirit to reign w/Him.
- 17. So, let me ask how you doin'? > If the Spirit wrote up a progress report on you, what grade would you get? A, B, C-?
 - a. Are you reigning over circumstances or are the circumstance's reigning over you?
 - b. Oh, now see? I just went & opened up a whole 'nuther sermon topic.
 - c. Well you just jot that down in your notes & work on THAT sermon yourself.
 - d. We have to press on ...
- 18. For not only are we kings & queens, the elders say Jesus has made us "priests to our God."
- 19. There's no need for a formal priesthood in the Church because **all** Christians are priests.
- 20. Our role as it relates to people is **king**, while our role as it relates to God is **priest**.
 - a. A priest's job is to *intercede* on behalf of others before God.
 - b. During the Millennium our task won't be just one way—Ruling others.
 - c. We'll be **asking** God for blessing on those we've been given oversight of.
- 21. There again, we see how *this life* is training & preparation for our coming assignment.
- 22. And it puts a new spin on a parable Jesus told in Luke 19.
 - a. He told of a man who gave a 10 of his servants \$100 each & told them to use it well in serving him.
 - b. Later he called them to settle up & give an account for what they'd done with what he gave.
 - c. 1 guy had turned multiplied it 10 times. So the master made him a rule over 10 cities.
 - d. Another guy multiplied it 5 times. He was given 5 cities.
 - e. The way Jesus words the parable makes it clear He was speaking of Himself as the master; the servants are His followers.
- 23. It seems pretty clear Jesus wants us to understand that our faithfulness in this life determines the scope of our assignment in the Millennium.
 - a. So are you praying for people now?
 - b. Are you praying God's blessing into their lives?
 - c. Are you walking them in prayer to His cross to be saved?
 - d. Are you praying them out of sin; out of rebellion & addiction & into the light of God's love?
- 24. Let's not be like the foolish servant in that parable who took what his master gave & stuck it in a dirty bandana. He didn't do *anything* with it.

CONCLUSION • A Royal Visit

1. Apparently, there's a church in Washington DC that's the *traditional* place Presidents go, if they go to church.

- a. It all set for his entourage & the routine is well established so the service isn't disrupted if he decides to go one Sunday.
- 2. Well, not long after George W took office, he & Laura decided to go to a *different* church; one not used to having the President attend. >> It created quite a stir in the congregation.
- 3. When I heard about that, I started thinking about what would happen if a President was visiting our area he stopped by here one Sunday.
- 4. What a scene it would be!
 - a. The Secret Service & Press would bring out many of the curious.
 - b. What would *our* reaction be?
 - c. Would we get on our phones and txt, tweet & FB "The President's at CCO!"
 - d. Would we think, "I hope the worship is good & Pastor Lance doesn't suck today."
 - e. Let's be honest; there would probably be a lot of talk & excitement.
- 5. Well, look around. Every Christian you see is a Queen / a King in training.
- 6. And while the President of the USA is a lofty & powerful position, it's nothing compared to the glory to be revealed in on our Coronation Day when Christ takes His throne.
