THOUGHTS ON THE JOURNEY

As we gather to worship on this Palm Sunday, we must guard our hearts against a fickle faith. As we look at the story of the first Palm Sunday, we see a crowd that was swept up in the moment but had no real understanding as to the person of Jesus Christ.


As Jesus appears on the scene, the people become fanatical. They believe Jesus to be the long-awaited Messiah. However, the "long awaited Messiah" they were looking for was not a humble servant mounted on a donkey, but a military leader who would bring an end to the Roman occupation. In the beginning, they were excited about Jesus. Then, it became evident that Jesus had no intention of overthrowing the government and their passion faded.

Fast forward five days. We see Jesus standing before Pilate and a crowd of onlookers that are worked into a frenzy. While the crowd on Friday is not exactly the same crowd from Sunday, certainly there is some cross over. However, this time they are not celebrating Jesus, but calling for his crucifixion. Some of the same people who shouted "Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord," now shouted, "crucify." Why such a change in only five days?

As I look at this text, I see two reasons for the shift. First, God did not do what they wanted. They wanted a military leader who would overthrow the government allowing the Jews to take leadership. But this is not who Jesus was nor was it His agenda. Second, they were swept away by the fury of the crowd. The excitement and passion of the moment won out over reasoned thought.

This story stands as a strong warning for you and me. We must be committed to following God even when He does not act as we would like. Second, our faith must be strong enough to stand against the pressure of the masses. We must be wholly convinced that Jesus Christ is worthy of our worship.
