## Meet the Member Jason & Kim Vinson

Jason and Kim Vinson have been members at Eternal for 6 years and currently live in Tega Cay. Jason grew up in Rock Hill and attended Clemson graduating in 2000 with a degree in Computer Science. Kim grew up in Columbia, SC and graduated from the University of South Carolina in music education and later received her masters at the University of Georgia. Kim took a job as a middle school orchestra



conductor and taught strings privately in the Atlanta area. Jason became a software programmer in Atlanta and did that for over 10 years before switching to the customer side of business – product management. Today Kim teaches music at Providence Classical School in Rock Hill and Jason works with a software company that helps banks protect their customers from financial crime.
