 - If you have a child under the age of 5, and would prefer not to be with others in order to give them special attention, you can reserve a spot in what we are calling our “Family Room” – tables for families, live stream worship, and bring your own toys if you like. Otherwise, stay with your children in the sanctuary, and they will be given an activity bag.
- Sunday, November 8th, we are doing things a little different. We are going to have an old fashion “hymn sing”. It won’t be the entire service, but we want to provide you the opportunity to sing some old familiar hymns. If you have a favorite, let us know via the Connect Card.
- Prayer Gathering – the 1st Wednesday of every month at noon, you are invited to gather with us for prayer at the church. We will use social distancing, gathering in groups of 6 in various rooms and wearing masks. The next one is November 4th. Please RSVP at yakimagrace.com/prayer.
