Burn the Mortgage!





Mission Development Team



Borchard Prayer Letter

Papua New Guinea

December 2021

We live by faith, not by sight. 2 Corinthians 5:7 (NIV)

Dear Praying Friends,

As I started preparing to go to Papua New Guinea, I realized that I still do not have the strength and stamina needed to live there. So, I decided that I will not be going back to Papua New Guinea at this point. This has been a difficult decision to make, but I believe that it is the right decision for me. I will continue to work here in the United

States to help with the Ipili project.

I was able to have a Zoom meeting with Mandita to tell him that I will not be going to PNG as I had originally planned. I am disappointed that we will not be able to work together in person, but I am hopeful that we will be able to meet via the internet to do Ipili work. We have decided to stop work on the book of Exodus, and to, instead, work on getting Genesis, Exodus chapters 1-5, Ruth, and Jonah printed in a book so that pastors, evangelists, and other church leaders will be able to read those for their people. I will be doing one last advisor check of Genesis to make sure that the meaning is correct. *Please pray for wisdom as I do this check*.

As the verse listed above from 2 Corinthians tells us, we live by faith, not by what we see. The Lord loves the Ipili people, and some of them are his children by faith in the Lord Jesus. The Ipili work is His work, and I believe that He will work His will in the Ipili people. They continue to face many difficulties, including fighting between clans in many parts of the area. I shared with Mandita the idea that he can work with church leaders to write Bible studies to

address the various problems that Ipili people face in their lives. *Please pray for wisdom for the church leaders* as they deal with these difficulties. Pray that they will use God's Word in Ipili to minister to the people.

Although Mandita and Margret reconciled after their difficulty, Mandita told me that Margret continues to have problems that will keep her from rejoining the work, so now Mandita is the only Ipili person working on the translation. I am confident that he and I can complete the work that still needs to be done.

Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. 1 Timothy 4:13 (NIV)

The apostle Paul gave Timothy these instructions, and it seems to me that these words can also help Mandita and the Ipili committee members know what their focus should be. During the next year they will need to take on responsibility for the Ipili work. They have God's Word in their language. They have the house/office to work at. There is a great need for Ipili people to hear and use God's Word. *Pray that Mandita and the committee members will go forward with the work in confidence that the Lord who gives them this work will work through them to do it. Pray that more and more people will desire to listen to and read God's Word in Ipili.*Your Partner in Bible Translation.
