

Our current balance of \$155,473 is getting us closer to the challenge of getting the loan below \$100,000 by the end of 2021. A great big thanks to members and friends who contributed 975 pounds of food items in March to the Friends in Deed Food Pantry in Pasadena. The van was stuffed with bags and boxes of food for the financially challenged. Recently, the Pantry featured the story of a young woman who remembers services her family received 30 years ago. How wonderful the extra food was compared to her usual beans and rice. Freedom from hunger and food insecurity played a part in helping this woman to do well in school and become a successful adult.

She recalls a dignified, joyful experience that lifted up the whole family. Her experience with Friends in Deed inspired her to find ways to help other people. She has founded a nonprofit in Altadena that organizes volunteer groups to do community projects. We, sometimes, never know the result of our generosity, words, and actions. We keep giving because God has given so much to us.

respond, and the Holy Spirit will assist us when our groans aren't articulated. Contact Jo for further info at: (626) 355-9433.




Mother's Day Picnic
