


## Leah's Hopes and Dreams

## BIRTHDAY GREETINGS

The UHBC Family extends our love and wishes to fellow member,

**Lorraine Love**

who is celebrating her **90th** birthday September 18th.

Lorraine Newsome was born September 18, 1931 in Goldsboro (Wayne County), North Carolina. She was educated in the city's schools, graduating from the Goldsboro High School with the Class of 1949. Her senior class Yearbook gave a list of activities she participated in and clubs she belonged to as follows: French Club, Goldmasquers, Future Homemakers of America, Parliamentarian, Glee Club, Community Service Committee, Marshall, Junior-Senior Decoration Committee and Junior Senior Program. She also participated in school programs, namely: "Land's End", "We Thank Thee" and the Easter Program.

After completing her high school education, nursing was the career she wanted to pursue. She moved to Charlotte, North Carolina and enrolled in the Presbyterian Hospital School of Nursing. In commencement ceremonies held at Charlotte's Elizabeth School Auditorium on September 5, 1952, she received her diploma. She furthered her education, receiving her Bachelor of Nursing degree from Queens College and her Masters degree from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte.

Upon her graduation from the nursing program, she became employed with Presbyterian Hospital, working full time until the birth of her first child in 1953. She then worked part time, but was mainly a stay-at-home mom, rearing her three children and being involved in their activities. During the year 1963 she served as President of the PTA at Enderly Park Elementary School. In 1964, after her youngest child began second grade, she returned to Presbyterian as a teacher in the School of Nursing, retiring in 1988 after 24 years service.

While a nursing student at Presbyterian, she met a young man who was a patient at the hospital, recovering from a serious trucking accident. As she took care of him during his long hospitalization, their friendship led to love. Because nursing students were not allowed to be married, they had to keep their romance a secret until she finished her studies. During that final year, 1952, she had to spend three months in psychiatric training at a hospital in New Jersey. It was during that time that the young couple decided to elope. Lorraine and Earl Robert Hill were married March 20, 1952 in Elkton, Maryland. Earl was a native of Skelton (Raleigh County), West Virginia. They were blessed with two sons (both now deceased) and one daughter. The family grew to include six grandchildren (one now deceased) and now, nine great-grandchildren. The Hills enjoyed 52 ½ years together until Earl's passing at age 82 on September 12, 2004.

The family made their home in west Charlotte, living first in the Camp Green Community and then the Enderly Park Community, moving to Cabarrus County in 1975 and settling in Harrisburg. In Charlotte they became members of Greenland Avenue Baptist Church where both Earl and Lorraine made professions of faith and were baptized into membership. They became active members of University Hills Baptist Church July 23, 1979 and were active in the Lewis Walker Sunday School Class (of which Lorraine remains a faithful member). Lorraine sang in the choir at Greenland Avenue and for 42 year has been a dedicated member of the UHBC Adult Choir.

Lorraine met Clarence Edward "Doc" Love, a native of Mooresville (Iredell County), North Carolina, but a longtime resident of the Newell Community near UHBC. They were married in a ceremony held here at UHBC on December 4, 2010 and enjoyed nearly seven years together before his death on Thanksgiving Day, November 23, 2017 at age 86.

Lorraine has lived an active and busy life, slowing only a little in the past year or two. An avid reader, she also has enjoyed knitting, crocheting and, for several years now, quilting.
