This program teaches children and their families how to grow, harvest and consume healthy whole foods. Providing valuable skills that lead to decreased obesity.

The initiative also includes healthy living cooking lessons throughout the year and the formation of a cookbook. The Urban Ag program has two growing spaces. Our first garden space was donated by USDA at the Blackland Research and Extension Center and our program has expanded with our very own 7 acre campus that includes 2 acres of high yield growing and the microgreen growing process. The location of this campus is significant because it sits in the heart of East Temple. East Temple used to be its own thriving predominantly black community and now there is very little evidence of the prosperity, creativity and ingenuity that existed. Un-Included Club is in position to re-ignite the entrepreneurship spirit that just needs to be reimagined through cooking classes, leadership training, entrepreneurship opportunities etc...

FUMC TEMPLE-UWF COMPLETE BABY BLANKETS FOR NEWBORNS

31 soft fleece blankets were completed in March by UWF at FUMC Temple as an ongoing project initiated by Karen Nalley, to honor babies who are baptized at FUMC-Temple. Once the blankets are blessed at a church service, they are placed in a monogramed canvass bag along with a special poem and a small keepsake knitted or crocheted blanket and presented to the parents at the time of the baby's baptism.

In 2021, 25 blankets were made for babies and youth and presented at their baptisms and confirmations. This has been a wonderful hands-on project and a support for the young families and youth in our church. More than a dozen UWF members worked to complete the project this year.


