OUR PRESIDENT.....



I recently returned from one of the most wonderful experiences a United Woman of Faith can have, attending Assembly 2022. Worshipping with thousands of other women and listening to music led by our all-female band was enough to make my heart soar. I went back to my room at night humming the tunes I had just learned. By far my favorite thing was listening to our theologian in residence, Janet Wolf, who wrote our past Mission u book, "Practicing Resurrection: The Gospel of Mark and Radical Discipleship." She was the face of our theology and when she spoke, she commanded attention. One of her memorable comments was: "And it was United Women in Faith who propped me up on every leaning side when the going got hard." That's what we do.

The most heartwarming event was the commissioning of 60 Home Missioners and Deaconesses. We have never had that many before. If you want to know more about those two professions, refer to the UWF website or the materials from this years' Call to Prayer and Self Denial. They use their experience to work in a variety of fields, all in the name of God. That could be working in a National Mission Institution or for a nonprofit or many other fields.

We had four women bishops who officiated at Assembly, Tracy Malone, LaTrell Easterling, Karen Oliveto, and Cynthia Harvey. It was wonderful to see them there.

I found a great renewal of spirit at the Assembly and am committed to attending May 15-17, 2026, in Indianapolis. I'm hoping that this time more of our sisters will be there. We only had 4 sisters from Central Texas Conference this year. I'll see YOU there.

This program teaches children and their families how to grow, harvest and consume healthy whole foods. Providing valuable skills that lead to decreased obesity.

The initiative also includes healthy living cooking lessons throughout the year and the formation of a cookbook. The Urban Ag program has two growing spaces. Our first garden space was donated by USDA at the Blackland Research and Extension Center and our program has expanded with our very own 7-acre campus that includes 2 acres of high yield growing and the microgreen growing process. The location of this campus is significant because it sits in the heart of East Temple. East Temple used to be its own thriving predominantly black community and now there is very little evidence of the prosperity, creativity and ingenuity that existed. Un-Included Club is in position to re-ignite the entrepreneurship spirit that just needs to be reimagined through cooking classes, leadership training, entrepreneurship opportunities etc...

DO YOU KNOW THE PLAN HE HAS FOR YOU?

SPIRITUAL GROWTH MESSAGE

Ephesians 2:10 "For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them."

Each of us is God's workmanship, reborn in Christ, spiritually transformed, ready to do the work that God has planned for us. Do you know the plan He has for you?

I read an article online called "Renew Your Mind through Daily Intentional Action" (no author identified) and I have used some of the thoughts from that article.

Living a rested, renewed, abundant life is not an accident. It is a series of intentional decisions, feelings, behaviors and habits that form together to create the identity that God has planned for us. Creating this life requires practice and that practice includes involving God in everything we do. We begin by renewing our minds.

Reveal and define how God sees you. Through reading His Word, you can visualize the life that He has planned for you. "But seek first the kingdom of God, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:33.

Explore what is holding you back. How do you speak to yourself and how do you think about yourself? Is it in line with how God sees you? Isaiah 43:18 says "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past." You are not who you used to be. You are being transformed continually into becoming more like Christ.

We have to nurture the vision that God reveals to us as we dream with Him. Write it down. Pray about it. Ask God to reveal his vision for you. Believe what God says about you. We need to have faith that he only wants what is best for us. No matter what is going on in our lives, God knows, God is with us, God will use it to draw us closer to Him.

We need to keep God's vision for us in mind daily to think, feel, behave, and identify like Christ. It takes daily practice and self-discipline. II Timothy 1:7 "for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

Choose a method that works for you in creating goals- monthly, yearly, daily- whatever works for you, write them down, work on them every day. You will be intentionally caring for your soul and continuously growing into the woman God has called you to be.

\$40.00 to Special Mission Recognition

The Special Mission Recognition (SMR) request will be sent to the District Treasurer with a copy of the 5-star Giver form attached. Please keep a copy of what you send to District. Make sure the Honoree understands that once the request is forwarded on to Conference, it may take up to 6 weeks to receive the SMR pin and card.

This program is open to non-UWF members. All church members should also be encouraged to participate in this program.

All funds for this award will be sent to the District Treasurer, with regular quarterly remittance and accounted for in the appropriate area of giving. If you do not have access to the Five-Star Giver form, please contact our district treasurer, Marty Portmann or download from the CTCUMW Resource Book at www.ctcuwfaith.org/member_area. **This form has also been emailed to your local president.**

The awards will be ordered from the Central Texas Conference Treasurer and the order should be received from the District Treasurer by August 15 of each year.

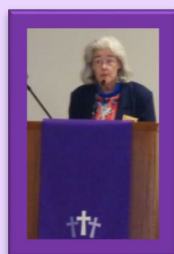

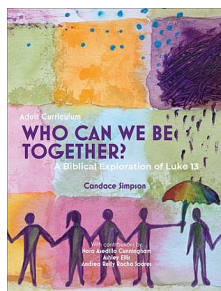

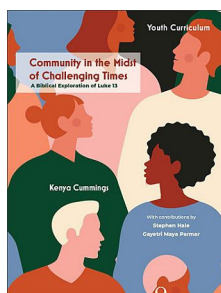
New Curricula for 2022

Beginning in spring 2022, Mission u introduced new curricula—one for children, one for youth and one for adults—all focused on a shared biblical theme. The new Mission u curricula will be more adaptable for use in small groups, local churches, vacation Bible schools, retreats, and other settings. All our 2022 curricula are based on Luke 13, as we turn to stories of Jesus that have anchored Christian communities in challenging times for over two millennia.

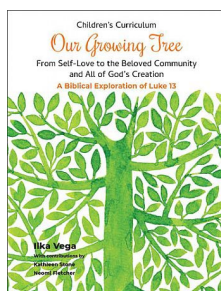
I had the opportunity of viewing a podcast featuring the 3 authors of our books.



Candace Simpson: *Who Can We Be Together? A Biblical Exploration of Luke 13*, the 2022 **adult curriculum** by Candace Simpson brings participants deeper into Jesus' teachings in this chapter of Luke to explore what it means to be in community.



Kenya Cummings: *Community in the Midst of Challenging Times*, a **youth curriculum** for 2022 by organizer and minister Kenya Cummings, brings facilitators and participants on a journey through stories that have anchored Christian communities for millennia, through both stability and times of turmoil and tragedy.



Ilka Vega : *The Growing Tree*, the **children's curriculum** for 2022 by social justice advocate and educator Ilka Vega, is a journey of spiritual growth and community building that helps children recognize the diversity of their capacities, spiritual gifts, and talents as well as their responsibilities to care for one another and for all of God's creation.

Thank you for joining us for Mission u. We are excited to see who we can be together!

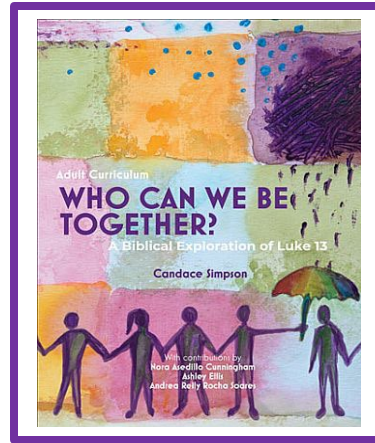

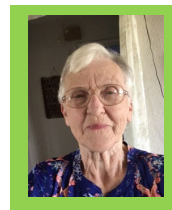

YES, HE WILL!

I attended the 2022 Human Trafficking Conference hosted in Dallas this week. As a social worker of ten years, I am amazed of how little I know and how our society continues to pull away from God. In these Godless times the one consistent component in all the sessions I attended was trauma, abuse, neglect and above all a lack of faith. These survivors overcame adversity that I cannot imagine. They were failed by the foster care system, family, and society.

Trafficking humans, slavery, and exploiting children are nothing new under the sun, however we must be diligent in our faith in God. Participating and listening to stories these survivors told proved to me that even in the most horrific situations God has you in the palm of his hand and will deliver you!

This conference renewed my faith in God as he is always blessing me even when you don't know to ask.
