- Worship \_\_\_\_\_ the warfare.
- When we \_\_\_\_\_ we're involved in warfare whether we realize it or not.
- Time and again the line is drawn in the book of Revelation between those who "worship the \_\_\_\_\_ and his \_\_\_\_\_" and those who worship \_\_\_\_\_.

- The temptation in the wilderness (Matthew 4:8-11). He tempts \_\_\_\_\_ to worship him.
- The ongoing temptation against the \_\_\_\_\_ today. The enemy continually seeks to distract, pervert, or dilute worship.
- The true test of worship is whether we have learned how to worship in the \_\_\_\_\_.
