MENTOR 2.0 AND BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS

Mentor 2.0 is a partnership between BBBS and Oshkosh North High School that combines technology with the life-changing impact of a mentor to empower students for college, community, and career success.

MENTORING FOR LIFE LONG SUCCESS

Mentor2.0 is a college and career readiness program that uses the power of mentoring as a strategy to support students to and through high school graduation as they plan for lifelong success. Our goal is that every student we serve has a plan for what happens after graduation.

Through the Mentor 2.0 program, students who might otherwise struggle with post-secondary success will be matched with a Big who is solely dedicated to supporting his or her success. Each match works together throughout the high school experience.

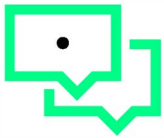

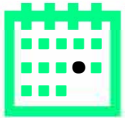
HOW IT WORKS



Mentor 2.0 partners each student with a Big for a total of 3 to 4 years.



Once a week, mentees communicate online with their Big.



Matches meet once a month for group events

How does it work?

- Mentors will be matched with a high school student, typically a freshmen, and work with them through a curriculum that builds skills for college and career success.
- Matches interact through a combination of weekly online communication and monthly in-person mentoring events.
- Professional guidance is provided by Big Brothers Big Sisters staff.

What are the volunteer eligibility?

- Be 21 year so age or older
- Hold a college degree (Associate or higher) or 4 years of professional work experience
- Live or work in our service area (Outagamie, Calumet, Winnebago, and/or Waupaca counties)

What are the volunteer expectations?

- Participate in weekly online communication with your mentee via a web platform
- Attend one in-person 2 hour event per month at Oshkosh North High School
- Walk alongside your mentee from freshmen through senior year

MENTOR 2.0 AND SCHOOLS: A PARTNERSHIP FOR COLLEGE SUCCESS

Mentor 2.0 program is fully integrated into the mentee's school day. Students take a class once a week during the school day, taught by the BBBS Program Coordinator, Pachee Stern. Our staff supervises all Mentor 2.0 events. Through these interactions, matches work together through our curriculum, focusing on four goals:

- Developing a strong personal friendships
- Nurturing post-secondary aspirations
- Building the essential life skills needed for post-secondary success
- Navigating the college and/or trade school process.

MENTORS YOU CAN TRUST

Our Bigs are all professionals who live or work in the communities we serve. They come from a variety of backgrounds and professional fields. We match mentees and mentors based on shared personal, academic, and career interests.

The safety of our students is our highest priority. Our screening process is rigorous and comprehensive. All mentors are screened, interviewed and must pass a comprehensive background check. Once accepted, we train mentors before they begin working with their mentees and then continually coach them throughout the match relationship. Our staff monitor communication between the match to ensure the quality and safety of each interaction.
