Why Are We Here?

Background

LEAD traces its roots to 1997 when the Church of God International Youth & Discipleship Department desired to start a revolutionary Discipleship and Ministry Training program strategically designed to raise up spiritual sons and daughters to impact the world. LEAD students go on a journey of faith that centers around **Living an Extraordinary Adventure of Discipleship**. In 2018, The Healing Place College came into partnership with the Church of God International Youth & Discipleship Department to officially become LEAD Institute Alabama.

Vision

LEAD Institute Alabama exists to Reach, Remedy, Ready, and Redirect the next generation of church ministry leaders.

Mission

Reach—To reach out and offer training for our students to be a voice in our world, connecting people with the Gospel, that they would become true followers of Jesus Christ.

Remedy—To offer healing to our students' Spirit, Soul and Body in order to promote complete, personal health.

- That all have sinned and come short of the glory of God and that repentance is commanded of God for all and necessary for forgiveness of sins.
- That justification, regeneration, and the new birth are wrought by faith in the blood of Jesus Christ.
- In sanctification subsequent to the new birth, through faith in the blood of Christ; through the Word, and by the Holy Ghost.
- Holiness to be God's standard of living for His people.
- In the baptism with the Holy Ghost subsequent to a clean heart.
- In speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance and that it is the initial evidence of the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
- In water baptism by immersion, and all who repent should be baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.
- Divine healing is provided for all in the atonement.
- In the Lord's Supper and washing of the saints' feet.
- In the premillennial second coming of Jesus. First, to resurrect the righteous dead and to catch away the living saints to Him in the air. Second, to reign on the earth a thousand years.
- In the bodily resurrection; eternal life for the righteous, and eternal punishment for the wicked.

1) LEAD ALABAMA CERTIFICATE OF MINISTRY

LEAD Alabama offers the Certificate of Ministry to provide students with practical leadership training that will prepare them to launch a successful future in a ministry or a marketplace position. You'll be fully prepared by the pastors at The Healing Place Church and top-level instructors. Each student has the opportunity to get on-the-field training and experience to gain expertise in a specific area of ministry while also being developed as a leader. The certificate is a two-year program.

- The academic core is a hybrid structure that Lee University President, Dr. Paul Conn, and Vice-President, Dr. Mark Walker, created utilizing Lee's online ministry degree platform as well as select course offerings through the Church of God Department of Education's School of Ministry that converts to Lee University credit. Students that take the full load of academics are eligible to apply for Pell Grants and Stafford Loans.
 - The hybrid approach reduces the overall cost as well as creates variety in the academic delivery system. The academic structure is for two years and allows students to continue online toward completion of a degree or to change majors as they start their junior academic year. We also chose to offer two academic tracks providing one that is ministry education focused and the other that is general education focused. Both tracks are situated in the Lee University Online Ministry Degree program. This gives students the best price available for their first two years in college. This option also allows students to transfer to other degrees with credits designed to help students reach graduation quicker.

2) BACHELOR OF ARTS / BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM LEE UNIVERSITY

LEAD Alabama offers the Degree plan as a separate, second option which includes more extensive and in-depth practical ministry leadership training and the opportunity to earn a Bachelor's Degree from Lee University. You'll be fully prepared by the pastors at The Healing Place Church and top-level instructors. Each student has the opportunity to get on-the-field training and experience to gain expertise in a specific area of ministry while also being developed as a leader. Through the degree option, you will have the opportunity to experience ministry leadership through our four-year leadership development plan. (see page 15)

In order to graduate LEAD Institute Alabama and complete the Degree option from Lee University, students must complete these core items:

- **Academic Core (Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Science Degree from Lee University)**
 - For those students wishing to pursue a degree, online classes will be offered via Lee University Online and Church of God School of Ministry.
 - The Lee University Degree Program offered via LEAD Institute Alabama is:
 - **Ministry Leadership**
 Potential Emphases: Business, Church Administration, Children's Ministry, Counseling, Discipleship, Music and Worship, Pastoral Ministry, Youth Ministry
 - Through the two-year program, students will earn credit towards a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree in Ministry Leadership, with emphases available in Pastoral Ministry, Music & Worship, Counseling, Discipleship, Church Administration, Youth

Ministry, Children's Ministry or Business. Upon completion of this program, students can continue their studies through Lee University Online. All credits earned in this program will count towards the completion of a four-year degree with Lee University.

3) Internship Only Option

LEAD Alabama offers the Internship Only option to provide interested students who are over the age of 20 with practical leadership training, ministry experience and the opportunity to pursue ministerial credentials. This program is available for students who are not able to commit to a full-time schedule at LEAD Alabama. You'll be trained by the pastors at The Healing Place Church and top-level instructors. Each student has the opportunity to get on-the-field training and experience to gain expertise in a specific area of ministry while also being developed as a leader. The Internship Only option is available on a year to year basis and does not include the Academic Core. Internship Only students attend on Tuesdays and Thursdays, in addition to Sundays and Wednesday nights, alongside their fellow LEAD Alabama interns.

All charges through Lee University and Church of God School of Ministry will be paid directly to these institutions by the student.

**Up to \$500 toward a ministry specific conference is covered by the LEAD Alabama fee for 3rd & 4th year students. Any remaining conference costs will be the responsibility of the student.

LEAD Institute Alabama Fee

As previously stated, the LEAD Institute Alabama Fee goes towards purchasing Internship specific books for the year (separate from Lee University Books), 1 LEAD Institute Alabama T-Shirt and 1 LEAD Institute Alabama Polo for each student for the year (additional shirts can be purchased by student), limited assistance for ministry training courses or conferences (depending upon year), and LEAD Institute Alabama Administrative Supplies and Resources. The LEAD Institute Alabama Fee should be paid to The Healing Place Church (designated to LEAD Institute Alabama) in its entirety no later than July 1 before the beginning of the upcoming academic year. Any returned checks will be charged a returned item fee, and payment for the LEAD Institute Alabama Fee will then be required to be made through certified check or money order.

Enrollment in Lee University Online

Lee University Online offers six sessions each academic year. Each session is seven weeks in length, and each course is built around a 7-week model that requires an average of 16-20 hours per week of academic work. With this in mind, we have established a limit of 2 courses per session that students can register in through Portico. If there are extenuating circumstances that merit an online student taking more than 2 courses per session, the student must petition for permission to register above the 6 credit hours per session.

Annual Registration

You can now annually *register* for Sessions A-D. You will work with your academic advisor to select courses for the 4 sessions in the Fall and Spring semesters, and then register in Portico for your annual schedule. New students will have an annual schedule provided for you by an initial advisor.

Registration Payment Policy

Each semester, you are required to pay a \$225 registration payment. If you have sufficient financial aid funds to cover all charges for the semester, the \$225 payment will be covered. Students paying the \$225 may follow the semester payment schedule provided below. As long as the student's account is paid in full at the completion of the Fall and Spring semesters, the student will not be required to pay another \$225 payment in the Spring and Summer semesters, respectively.

Course Check-in

In order to stay compliant with changes in the U.S. Financial Aid system, we require you to check in to each of your courses in the first week of the class before they can proceed to Unit 1 in Moodle.

Confirmation of Enrollment

You will be confirmed for each session in which you enroll after **both** checking into class via Moodle **and** making a \$225 registration payment (Financial aid can be used for registration payment **only** if aid exceeds total costs of attendance for the current semester).

Book Vouchers

Students will receive a book voucher only when their financial aid exceeds the amount of their school bill. If a student qualifies for a book voucher, the student will be able to go to the bookstore and use his or her Lee ID to purchase textbooks after he or she completes registration. Lifestyle Expectations

Attendance

- Excused Absences - Maximum of 3 per 8 week session
 - Circumstances that define an excused absence: Medical written excuse from a physician or death of a family member. For any other circumstance to be considered an excused absence, approval by the LEAD Alabama administration must be received at least 4 weeks in advance. More than 3 excused absences in a given session will result in a meeting with the LEAD Alabama Director to ensure that student is maintaining the standards of LEAD Alabama.
- Unexcused Absences
 - Unexcused absences are defined as absences for anything other than a specified excused absence, without prior approval LEAD Alabama Director approval. Unexcused absences will affect leadership opportunities during the given session. More than 1 unexcused absence per session will result in probation.
- Tardies
 - 4 unapproved tardies to assigned locations within a given grading session is equivalent to 1 unexcused absence.
- Annual Vacation Absences
 - Each intern is allowed 5 annual vacation days each calendar year. Vacation days must be approved at least 1 month in advance, and cannot include more than 1 Sunday a year for vacation. Students on probation for unexcused absences will lose one vacation day per session on probation.

Dress

As Christians, we are to strive to show Christ in every aspect of our lives. EVERY part of who you are speaks loudly to the people we are attempting to connect with. For this reason, we ask that you please dress modestly *always*, especially while present at educational and ministry activities. We define modest attire as clothing that is not revealing in ANY way.

Therefore, we ask that during educational and ministry activities,

- Ladies not wear halter-tops, tank tops, tube tops, anything strapless, and/or anything low cut.
- If skirts are to be worn, we ask that they be of a modest length and appropriate fit [not too tight].
- Modest shorts are only to worn on work days or when LEAD Alabama gives specific permission.
- For gentlemen, we ask that pants always cover your rear and that shirts have sleeves.
- As is the case for ladies, modest shorts are only to worn on work days or when LEAD Alabama gives specific permission.
- Dress in a way that is worthy of respect. "...live in such a way that you will not cause another believer to stumble and fall." [Romans 14:13] **Unless otherwise specified, daily LEAD Alabama attire will be jeans or dress pants, business casual shirt, and comfortable shoes.**

There will be times when you are expected to wear your LEAD Alabama attire, so you will be expected to take care of it. Any cost for replacement or additional shirts will be the responsibility of the student (polos-\$30, t-shirts-\$15; prices can change according to manufacturer's pricing).

Disruptive Behavior

Any behavior deemed as disruptive to the overall learning environment at LEAD Alabama will not be tolerated. Excessive tardiness, talking during class or services, using your phone during class or services, distracting others from their work, etc., are unacceptable. Efforts will be made to establish order, but if efforts are not productive, further disciplinary action will be taken.

Alcohol, Drugs, Tobacco, Tobacco Alternatives

Because of the freedom given by Jesus Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, we are no longer slaves to sin and other negative forces. Scripture also encourages us to cast aside any weight that may knock us off course. Because of this, and our desire to not fall under bondage again, LEAD Alabama is committed to total abstinence from alcohol, drugs, tobacco, tobacco alternatives, and any other addictive substances. LEAD Alabama reserves the right to require drug testing, at the student's expense, of any student suspected of drug use. If at any time a student

voluntarily comes forth with such a struggle, counseling through THP Church will be made available and student will be placed on probation.

Language and Behavior

As new creations in Christ, our lives should reflect the character of Jesus Christ and the fruit of the Holy Spirit. Similarly, we are to live in such a way that is sensitive to the needs and feelings of others as a demonstration of our love for them and for God. Therefore, our language and behavior are to reflect and promote the heart of Philippians 4:8 NLT: "what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable...things that are excellent and worthy of praise."

Sexual Morality

LEAD Alabama encourages wholesome interaction between students, between students and faculty, and among faculty, but stands firmly against premarital and extramarital relations, same-sex sexual behavior and any other forms of sexual behavior that violates Scripture. Engaging in sexual behavior that violates scripture and/or that is unacceptable outside of marriage will result in suspension or expulsion from LEAD Alabama. LEAD Alabama students in their 1st year are not allowed to date other LEAD Alabama students, and are discouraged from dating as a whole during their 1st year in order to promote healthy focus and accountability. LEAD Alabama students in their 2nd year are allowed to date in groups, but no one-on-one dates.

Students and faculty are to avoid putting themselves in situations that could result in temptation. Students are not to stay the night in the presence of someone they could be attracted to or tempted by. Students are not allowed in residential area of students of the opposite gender without written permission from the LEAD Alabama Director.

Excessive use of force for sexual gratification will result in immediate expulsion from LEAD Alabama. Cross-dressing is not acceptable in the life of anyone involved in LEAD Alabama.

Discrimination, Harassment, Sexual Harassment, and Related Inappropriate Conduct

LEAD Alabama seeks to provide a safe and healthy environment for our students and faculty. LEAD Alabama forbids harassment and discrimination of any kind relating to age, race, color, ancestry, national origin, service in the uniformed services (as defined in state and federal law), veteran status, gender, gender identity, physical or mental disability, or genetic information. Discriminatory conduct and harassment, as well as sexual misconduct and relationship violence, violate the dignity of individuals, impede the realization of the LEAD Alabama mission, and will not be tolerated. Those in violation of the harassment and discrimination policies of LEAD Alabama are subject to disciplinary procedures. LEAD Alabama reserves the right to uphold policies based on biblical standards in all areas of LEAD Alabama student life.

Social Media

Social Media is considered an extension of a student's social life and is held to the same lifestyle standards expected of a LEAD Alabama student, including, but not limited to language and behavior, treatment of other people, and anything that would reflect negatively on Christ or the church. Social Media can be very positive, but can also become a very negative influence very quickly. LEAD Alabama reserves the right to have a student remove any post, media, comments, and/or alternative profiles that violates these lifestyle expectations.

Pornography

Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines pornography as "1: the depiction of erotic behavior (as in pictures or writing) intended to cause sexual excitement. 2: material (such as books or a photograph) that depicts erotic behavior and is intended to cause sexual excitement". Viewing or possessing pornography is unacceptable in the lifestyle of anyone affiliated with LEAD Alabama.

LEAD Alabama Liability

LEAD Alabama is not responsible for personal property left on campus, or goods, cars, bikes, etc., stored or left on campus. LEAD Alabama does not assume any liability for the care and/or protection of any vehicle or its contents while parked on campus. We encourage all students to keep their vehicles locked when

parked on campus and all of their personal property with them personally.

Technology

Computer network and internet access are provided for students and faculty of LEAD Alabama for the purpose of furthering students' education and providing tools for faculty in support of their duties. All members of LEAD Alabama must steward technology well.

It is the policy of LEAD Alabama that all members of its community act in accordance with the responsibilities, relevant laws and contractual obligations, and the highest standard of ethics. Abuse of the computer network or the Internet may result in disciplinary action, including possible dismissal, and civil and criminal liability. Access to the computer network and internet is a privilege granted to LEAD Alabama students and faculty and should not be shared with any outside parties.

LEAD Alabama Students and faculty will be expected to keep the latest LEAD Alabama recommended technology accountability software on their electronic devices (computer, phone, tablet, etc.) to promote ministry leader accountability.

Disciplinary Procedures

LEAD Alabama reserves the right to take action by way of student conference, suspension or expulsion from LEAD Alabama if the afore stated guidelines are not adhered to. Suspensions will consist of a 1 day to possible 1 year period, based on the severity. Students may also be expelled depending on the severity of the offense or if it is deemed a "chronic offense" [one that continues after being instructed otherwise]. During suspension, students will be expected to make progress in their Christian walk, especially in the area[s] they were disciplined for. If sufficient progress is not made, students subject themselves to further action. LEAD Alabama believes in extending grace to anyone in their growth process, but "extra chances" are not promised. Expulsion from LEAD Alabama will be solely at the discretion of the leadership of LEAD Alabama. In cases of suspension or expulsion, there will be no refunds due to classes or experiences missed.
