Property Updates at First Christian

Bethany Roof

Missouri Builders Services, which has completed several roofing projects for the Church in the recent past, completed the re-roofing of Bethany in a timely and professional manner, for the bid price (\$49,343). The new roof will give us confidence in the integrity of the structure for



years to come, although we probably need to consider repairs (tuckpointing) to the brick walls in the fairly near future.

Basement Mold Remediation

Asbestos Removal Services Inc (ARSI) has completed remediation work in the basement, addressing mold, and asbestos discovered when removing old carpet. The "not to exceed" price of \$17,700 was exceeded, so the final invoice was for this price, plus \$3900 for removing the previously undetected asbestos tile under the carpet. The total invoice was \$21,600. Both of these projects were approved to be funded through the repair account, which still leaves a significant balance in that account.

After remediation, air testing was again performed. The results of the original testing showed higher than baseline mold quantities in five locations of the basement, and recommended a remediation plan that was very extensive. We opted to perform remediation to a lesser extent and then retest. The second report indicated successful work, but not All samples except one (from the east hallway) were within recommended limits. Because we successfully cleaned most of the mold spores, our contractor has recommended installing air circulating procedures, and then retesting after a period of time. We have placed a commercial dehumidifier in the area and are consulting with an engineer to determine if any other measures are readily achievable. More to come later on this issue.


