SESSION ONE

Understanding God's Mission

To discover God's mission in the world, you must first understand:

1. God's overall purpose in creating human beings.
2. Jesus' mission in coming to earth.

WHY GOD CREATED US

1. We were made to have a _____.

Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness."

GENESIS 1:26 (NIV)

Long ago, even before he made the world, God chose us to be his very own through what Christ would do for us . . . His unchanging plan has always been to adopt us into his own family by sending Jesus Christ to die for us.

EPHESIANS 1:4-5 (TLB)

2. We were made to _____.

For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.

ROMANS 8:29 (NIV84)

God knew what he was doing from the very beginning. He decided from the outset to shape the lives of those who love him along the same lines as the life of his Son. The Son stands first in the line of humanity he restored. We see the original and intended shape of our lives there in him.

ROMANS 8:29 (THE MESSAGE)

3. We were made to _____.

God has made us what we are. In Christ Jesus, God made us to do good works, which God planned in advance for us to live our lives doing.

EPHESIANS 2:10 (NCV)

4. We were made to _____.

He has planted eternity in the human heart.

ECCLESIASTES 3:11 (NLT)

This was his purpose: that when the time is ripe he will gather us all together.

THE MISSION OF JESUS

The Problem: Our sin has broken our relationship with God.

Remember that in the past you were without Christ . . . You had no hope, and you did not know God.

For I have a great sense of obligation to people in both the civilized world and the rest of the world.

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all.

What Is the Good News?

1. God became a man so _____.

It is the Good News about [God's] Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who came as a human baby, born into King David's royal family line; and by being raised from the dead he proved to be the mighty Son of God, with the holy nature of God himself.

ROMANS 1:3-4 (TLB)

2. Jesus died for my sins so _____.

It is this Good News that saves you if you firmly believe it . . . that Christ died for our sins. He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, as the Scriptures said.

1 CORINTHIANS 15:2-4 (NLT96)

For God was in Christ, restoring the world to himself, no longer counting men's sins against them but blotting them out. This is the wonderful message he has given us to tell others.

2 CORINTHIANS 5:19 (TLB)

3. Jesus destroyed death so _____.

[Jesus] destroyed death, and through the Good News he showed us the way to have life that cannot be destroyed.

2 TIMOTHY 1:10 (NCV)

4. Salvation is a free gift so _____.

People are made right with God by his grace, which is a free gift. They are made right with God by being made free from sin through Jesus Christ. God gave Jesus as a way to forgive sin through faith.

ROMANS 3:24-25 (ICB99)

5. It is based on faith so _____.

Repent and believe the good news!

MARK 1:15 (NIV)

The Good News shows how God makes people right with himself—that it begins and ends with faith. As the Scripture says, “Those who are right with God will live by trusting in him.”

SHARING MY STORY

In Jesus' day, they only used nets for fishing. Today, we have many methods for fishing, including bass boats with built-in sonar equipment!

My circle of influence is "my fishing pond." God holds me most responsible for the people I already have relationships with. Where do I start? **Those closest to me!**

Go home to your family and tell them how much the Lord has done for you and how he has had mercy on you.

MARK 5:19 (NCV)

This is called receptivity. How open are they to the Good News?

It is important to realize that people go through a process in coming to faith in Christ, and they must be approached differently depending on where they are.

FACT: Some people are close to making a commitment to Christ, while others have a long way to go!

KEY: Effective evangelism relies on assessing how receptive a person is and then helping them take the next step.

Examples of Levels of Spiritual

Receptivity from the Bible

Listen to me, you stubborn-hearted, you who are far from righteousness.

ISAIAH 46:12 (NIV84)

[Jesus with an unbeliever] Realizing this man's understanding, Jesus said to him, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God."

MARK 12:34 (TLB)

He has brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were very far away from him, and to us Jews who were near.

EPHESIANS 2:17 (TLB)

Now you belong to Christ Jesus. Though you once were far away from God, now you have been brought near to him because of the blood of Christ.

EPHESIANS 2:13 (NLT96)

My work was to plant the seed in your hearts, and Apollos' work was to water it, but it was God, not we, who made the garden grow in your hearts.

1 CORINTHIANS 3:6 (TLB)

HOW TO BUILD A BRIDGE OF FRIENDSHIP

A Plan for Sharing Your Faith

Good friendships are usually intentional, rather than accidental. Developing friendship with unbelievers often requires going the extra mile, taking some risks, and moving outside your comfort zone. With our busy lifestyles, this takes planning. If you don't plan to cultivate friendships with unbelievers, you'll find that you never have the time to do so.

We should make [our] plans— counting on God to direct us.

PROVERBS 16:9 (TLB)

Step 1: Become _____ of the unbelievers God has placed in your life.

- Make a list of them by name.
- Realize that they are your responsibility.
- Assess each person's level of spiritual receptivity.
- Discover and write down their interests and needs.
- Look for areas of common ground that you can build on.
- Figure out what kind of testimony each person would respond to.

Step 2: Commit to _____.

- Use your list to pray daily for your unsaved friends.
- Pray that God will draw them to himself (John 6:44).
- Pray that God will remove their spiritual blindness (2 Corinthians 4:3-4).
- Pray that the Holy Spirit will make their heart receptive (John 16:8-13).
- Pray you'll get the opportunity to share a clear witness (Colossians 4:3-5).
- Pray that God will give you wisdom in what to say (James 1:5).
- Pray the Holy Spirit will use the words you say (1 Thessalonians 1:5).

Step 3: Show you _____.

- Treat everyone with respect as people, not as "prospects."
- Be a genuine friend. Help them in practical ways.
- Be a good listener. It is a great way to show love.

- Make service your aim, not recruitment.
- Invite them into your home.
- Consciously focus your concern on meeting their needs.
- Go out of your way to love them until they ask you why.
- Accept people as they are, without being judgmental.

Step 4: Be ready to _____.

- Identify yourself as a positive, joyful follower of Christ.
- Share a testimony when the occasion naturally arises. (It will!)
- Never force the Good News. Be patient. God is working!
- Use crisis situations to show why we all need God.
- Ask questions that lead to spiritual discussions.
- Give them appropriate message CDs, downloads, podcasts, or books to read.
- Concentrate on the essential. Don't get sidetracked by hang-ups.
- Invite them to a service at church.
- Offer to lead them in a prayer of commitment after sharing the Good News.

APPENDIX A

Twelve Tips to Effectively Share Your Testimony

1. Think through what you might say.

Everything you say should be kind and well thought out so that you know how to answer everyone.

COLOSSIANS 4:6 (GW)

Intelligent people think before they speak; what they say is then more persuasive.

PROVERBS 16:23 (GNT)

2. Ask God for help in choosing the right words.

Pray for me that when I speak, God will give me words so that I can tell the secret of the Good News without fear.

EPHESIANS 6:19 (NCV)

3. Show love.

If I have no love, my speech is no more than a noisy gong or clanging bell.

1 CORINTHIANS 13:1 (GNT)

**“PEOPLE DON’T CARE HOW MUCH
WE KNOW, UNTIL THEY KNOW HOW
MUCH WE CARE!”**

4. Be positive and pleasant.

A wise, mature person is known for his understanding. The more pleasant his words, the more persuasive he is.

PROVERBS 16:21 (GNT)

Conduct yourself with wisdom in your interactions with outsiders (non-believers), make the most of each opportunity [treating it as something precious].

COLOSSIANS 4:5 (AMP)

A word of encouragement does wonders!

PROVERBS 12:25 (TLB)

5. Never use any put downs.

Don't expect people to act like believers until they are believers!

Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out.

COLOSSIANS 4:6 (THE MESSAGE)

6. Tell stories—give examples.

People always relate better to a story.

Jesus always used stories and illustrations like these when speaking to the crowds. In fact, he never spoke to them without using such parables.

MATTHEW 13:34 (NLT)

7. Lighten up.

The Son of man came, enjoying [life]. . .

LUKE 7:34 (PHILLIPS)

8. Be yourself; be natural; don't try to sound "spiritual."

Dear brothers, even when I first came to you I didn't use lofty words and brilliant ideas to tell you God's message.

1 CORINTHIANS 2:1 (TLB)

Your speech should be unaffected and logical, so that your opponent may feel ashamed at finding nothing in which to pick holes.

TITUS 2:8 (PHILLIPS)

9. Be vulnerable and authentic.

Because we loved you, we were happy to share not only God's Good News with you, but even our own lives . . .

1 THESSALONIANS 2:8 (NCV)

We have spoken frankly to you; we have opened our hearts wide.

2 CORINTHIANS 6:11 (GNT)

Be sure that you live in a way that brings honor to the Good News of Christ.

PHILIPPIANS 1:27 (NCV)

10. Memorize a few key verses.

Concentrate . . . on being a workman with nothing to be ashamed of, and who knows how to use the word of truth to the best advantage.

2 TIMOTHY 2:15 (PHILLIPS)

11. Keep it simple.

I fear . . . [Satan will corrupt you] from the simplicity that is in Christ.

1 CORINTHIANS 11:3 (NKJV)

12. Remember, the Holy Spirit is using your words.

You are not trying to convince anyone on your own.

For when we brought you the Good News, it was not only with words but also with power, for the Holy Spirit gave you full assurance that what we said was true . . .

1 THESSALONIANS 1:5 (NLT)

APPENDIX B

How to Lead Your Testimony into a Conversation

1. Listen for problems or needs where Jesus has helped you.

"You know, that used to be a big issue in my life, too (or my marriage, etc.). In fact, I felt pretty hopeless (frustrated, etc.). But then I discovered something that made a major difference in my life."

2. Refer to something in the news or on TV that deals with a common need or problem.

"Did you read about . . . ? I can identify with how those people feel. It wasn't that long ago that I struggled with that, too. But then something happened that changed everything for me . . ."

Start with a statement they agree with or a situation where they can relate.

**"IT SEEMS LIKE LIFE IS GETTING
FASTER AND FASTER."**

**"SOMETIMES LIFE JUST GETS SO
COMPLICATED."**

**"LIFE DOESN'T ALWAYS TURN OUT
THE WAY YOU PLANNED IT."**

3. Apologize to people you've known a long time but haven't witnessed to.

"Bill, I need to apologize to you. We've known each other a long time, and I consider you to be a good friend. But friends don't keep secrets—and I've never told you about the best thing that ever happened to me. I guess I was afraid of what you'd think. Anyway, . . . (begin your story)."

Each day tell someone that he saves.

APPENDIX C

PREPARING A TESTIMONY

- Pray and ask God to give you the right words.
- Write it out on paper. God honors preparation.
- Keep it short and to the point. Don't lose sight of your goal.
- Be succinct. Avoid excessive, unnecessary details.
- Try to keep your testimony less than three minutes.
- Refer to experiences most people have in common.
- Share a slice of your life (a story) that they will identify with.
- Be honest about your continuing struggles. Your life is not perfect.
- Don't imply that all of your problems ended at conversion.
- Spend the most time on Part B: The Difference It Has Made in My Life (page 25).
- Emphasize why you received Christ (the benefits of doing it).
- Mention the benefit of being certain of your destiny when you die.
- Don't exaggerate or brag about pre-conversion sins.
- Don't make negative remarks about other religions or people.
- Don't mention any denomination.
- Don't quote a lot of Scripture (a maximum of one verse).
- Don't answer questions they haven't asked.
- Give concrete examples of the changes in your life.
- The more specific you are, the more dynamic it will be.
- Avoid using dates, names, and ages. It doesn't matter to them.
- Be prepared. Practice it until it feels and sounds natural.
- Read it aloud and edit it to make it conversational.
- Let a friend read it and make suggestions.
- Speak casually and informally, in a matter-of-fact tone.
- Don't dramatize or embellish your story.
- Don't share mystical experiences. Share on their level, not yours.
- Don't talk down to people. Don't sound "preachy."
- Use "I, me, and my"—not "you." It's about you—not them.
- Use humor—it reduces tension and relaxes people. Smile!
- Choose a central theme (see the list on page 28).
