Jerilyn and I are completing our annual medical “tune-ups.” Spark plugs, oil change and rotation of tires! Makes heaven sound all the sweeter, Amen! We are looking forward to returning to India and Myanmar.

**INDIA** – An update on the Kannada King James Bible: In May, Jerilyn and I met with a fellow missionary and his local pastor here in the states. It was a fruitful meeting and the desire to have a more excellent Kannada KJV Bible was discussed and prayed about. In June, Pastor Raju, in India, was able to meet with missionaries and local pastors in Mangalore. Unfortunately, our friend and the elder missionary suddenly passed away one week after the meeting. Pastor Raju had shared his burden and ours for work on this translation. Please continue to pray that these pastors and translation teams will move forward on this urgent need for the Bible.

Nambike Baptist and Niricksha Baptist Churches held their Vacation Bible Schools. Pastor Raju reported an average of one hundred twenty-five attended the six-day extravaganza! Pastor Arun reported an average of twenty-eight attending his three-day VBS!

**MYANMAR** – The month of May was unbearably hot according to Pastor Jacob. Temperatures exceeded 115 degrees and the situation worsened due to the electrical power being cut off in the city of Yangon. The heat did not keep Pastor Jacob and his wife Sandar from sharing the Gospel. They traveled to the capital city of Nay Pyi Taw and had the privilege of witnessing to dozens of folks. Finally, a Buddhist woman and six teenagers accepted Jesus as their personal Saviour. Another member of Bethel Baptist Church traveled during the summer to four places in Shan state. She organized children Bible camps and ministered to 300 children. Dozens accepted Jesus as their Saviour. The students of Bethel Baptist Bible Institute have returned back to the school and reported on their ministry activities in their home places. Among the students, Samuel preached every Sunday and witnessed daily to many who had never heard the Gospel. Steven witnessed to children and six came to Christ. Cingpi witnessed, and five came to trust Jesus as their Saviour. Pastor Jacob continues to ask for prayer for protection for our graduates who are pastoring in areas where there is persecution.
