Greetings from Quarantine! We pray that this letter finds you all healthy and safe. We are enjoying our family time and the major transitions that have occurred this year. Although so much has changed with our ministry, we are thankful for all that the Lord has done and how He continues to work.

Our January trip to City Baptist Church in Lagro, Philippines with Missionary Calvin Houser, and our February trip to New Life Baptist Church in Arequipa, Peru with Missionary Kason Bloom were both fruitful. Both weeks were filled with hot days, long lines, and awesome team mates. We are so thankful to report that with the two weeks combined, we saw 3,620 patients visit the clinics. Each patient was given the opportunity to hear the Gospel in their heart language and we are blessed to report that over 1,017 of them started a personal relationship with Christ. To God be the glory for the many souls saved and lives changed! Our team members came from all over the United States and enjoyed treating thousands of patients as the local churches shared the gospel with each individual. What a blessing!

We were thrilled when Dr. Jason Frazer and his family officially moved to Honduras in January to serve as the administrator of the Rearick Surgical Center (RSC). The Frazer's found a home, started learning the language, and began settling into their new country. We made plans for a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the RSC...

...and then March came in like a lion...

Due to the pandemic, Medical Missions Outreach had to cancel the grand-opening of the RSC. We also made the painful decision to start postponing trips. Due to governments closing down, travel bans, and the unknown direction of the virus itself, all remaining trips for 2020 have been postponed until 2021.

Despite trip dates changing, we have still managed to serve! We were able to donate masks and personal protective equipment to seven nursing homes, a hospital system in Florida, and a missionary in Hong Kong. We have also purchased food for a small village in Romania where we served last summer. Many of our staff are taking advantage of the postponed international ministry opportunities and have begun working on the front lines caring for patients in local hospitals and clinics. We beg you to pray with us for their health during this time. This virus has brought many tears and heartaches, but also many times to magnify the Lord. Our staff have been asked to pray with family members, other medical professionals, and encourage church families. The rest of our staff have been diligently working from home refining protocol, engaging with missionaries and team members through social media, and getting ready for our biggest year yet- 2021! I promise, we are not sitting idle. We are and will continue to be good stewards of the time and resources God has provided through our faithful partners like you. We simply cannot thank you enough for enabling us to go.

Please pray for our upcoming calendar launch on June 1, 2020. Please consider traveling with us in 2021- we need you! We expect to serve in 15 countries with 500 team members next year. I hope you are one of them!
