The verse above is an encouragement for all those who find themselves in the midst of much work for the Lord. Paul knew what it was like to be busy in the ministry, but instead of complaining, he encourages us to always abound in the work that the Lord has given to us. In other words, he is admonishing us to not live stagnate lives, but to do more and more for the Lord, as He allows. May and June saw us abounding more and more with various ministries. **We were able to experience God’s blessings in profound ways.** I would like to briefly share some of these experiences:

Encouraging Friends:

We always enjoy having families visit us, but there is something even sweeter when other missionaries stay for a few days in our home. One of the ministries that God has put on our hearts is to be an encouragement to other missionaries. At the beginning of May we had friends of ours, who are serving in Kazakhstan, stay with us for a few days. **Please pray for this family as they are striving to reach people with the Gospel in a place full of political corruption and religious persecution.**

Ladies Tea:

Shortly after our friends went back to Kazakhstan, Kelly spoke at a Ladies tea for the **Ansbach Baptist Church, a ministry for the US military where my father is the pastor.** She spoke on the powerful subject of “Growing where God has placed you”.

Church Service on Saturday?

A week after the ladies tea, our church had a special church service on Saturday. Once a year, on a Sunday, our city has a marathon that raises money for orphans in Africa. The starting line of the race, vendors and various activities, are all a block away from our church building. The route of the race runs right passed the church’s main entrance. With drums beating, music blaring, and onlookers cheering, it makes having a church service very difficult - along with the fact that the city’s streets are closed off for the marathon. So, our church improvised and held services on Saturday. But during the marathon, we took advantage of the opportunity and passed out Gospel literature to the on-lookers and invited them to our BBQ Fest.

Corrie asked me to preach and Kelly gave her testimony. Please pray for this wonderful church as they continue to grow and be a light to the densely populated area of Madrid where they are located.

Twice a year our church has a combined German/American service with our sister church from Oberfpraundorf and Hohenfels Baptist Church. We invited a German guest speaker, Willi Slischewski, to preach for this special service and I translated in English.
