The snow is finally starting to melt as are most of the covid restrictions. March 21st marks the day that mask restrictions are lifted and by April 1st we will no longer be required to have a PCR test prior to entering Canada. There seems to be a lighter attitude when talking to people around town. Spring is in the air in every sense of the word. God is so good!

We have decided to open up the mission again. Several first nation people in town are not comfortable in a "traditional" church setting so we invited a few to join us for a service at 11 am. The majority who came are not addicted to alcohol, although they used to be. Bob is teaching on the last days, the war and the rapture since that's what is on the minds of the people. We encouraged them to come to church on Sunday Night. Bob is also recording his messages to put on YouTube.



Mishkeegogamang had a total of 320 covid cases but only 4 unresolved. The lockdown ends this weekend, so Lord willing, we will be able to have a service this Sunday. It has been almost 2 months since our last service. We sure miss seeing people in person. Bob is busy writing a couple of tracts for handout packages that we can distribute on the reserve. We are anxious to do some visiting there.

The owner of our town school bus gave Bob permission to us it for youth night.

The kids were so excited they were running down the street to get on the bus. It only holds 12 kids so I still need to follow him to pick up the excess kids. It is a

great solution for the time being. We still need a van for the church on the reserve and for safe zone. Keep praying God show us where and when.

I'd like to introduce to you, Lorelei. She is 14 yrs old. She has been involved in Bible Clubs and Safe Zone, off and on, since the beginning. She comes from a single parent home where the older siblings are raising the younger ones. Recently, she asks us, "if someone is a very good person, will they go to Heaven?" She a very quiet girl and extremely shy around others. Please pray for her salvation and God's protection.

The other day Cindy was filling in for the school secretary for a couple of hours. What a great opportunity to connect with the kids. The secretary had talked to her about the questionable curriculum here in Canada. Even as a Muslim, she understands the abnormality of such lifestyles and God's intent for man and woman. They seem to relate to us quite well as they practice high morals and values in their own home.

She has noticed a couple of other new teachers that presumably are Christians. One of the teachers is here during the week and then travels 3 hours back home on the weekends. Cindy encouraged him to join us on Wednesday evenings for church. Opportunities like this don't come in our everyday circle. In our small town, door-to-door outreach isn't well-received, so developing contacts through kids and those we meet outside our home seems to work best.

This past week, we spent some time with an elderly woman who is dying from diabetes. She requested someone to come and sing Gospel songs, so they called us. We then made a trip to Sioux Lookout to see an elder who had chest pains and will need a stent. Then we headed to another hospital in Thunder Bay (3.5 hrs away) to visit another lady who has been hospitalized for about 6 weeks with covid. She is finally off the ventilator. We sang, shared scripture and prayed with them. While there we met several other people we know and were able to encourage them to follow the Lord. Little did we know that so much of our ministry would involve the sick and the dying.
