



Templetons To Peru

Dear friends in Christ,

August, 2019

Things are moving forward on the repairs and improvements at our camp outside Lima. We put out the word for people to come and help us do some work at camp. Over a period of four days, 37 people from 9 different churches took their holiday time and made the sacrifice to travel all the way to our camp to work hard just to make it better for people to go and hear the Word of God.

Two men brought their compressor and spraying equipment. Some brought sand paper, paint brushes, rollers and pans, while others brought tools needed to plaster and cement holes. There were young teens, men and women. Some worked a day, some two or three, while others worked all four days. Our church alone had 14 volunteers.

Everyone really went at it and it was a bee-hive of activity. We started right after breakfast and went until there was no more light in the day and no more energy in us. The dining hall and entire chapel along with all the benches were sanded, grinded, puttied, and painted. Electrical outlets, and lighting were also repaired. The face lift for the dining hall and chapel give them a clean and attractive look. There is still a lot to be done, but at least we have started.

We want to thank those who gave financially toward helping with the camp. We deeply appreciate your sacrifice.

Two young men recently joined our church. What a blessing to see young men faithfully attending and serving Christ in a local church. We are in the middle of some major planning for our ministry. For months we have been planning for these changes which we will be sharing with you soon.

Many have asked us where we are with the three radio licenses we purchased from the government. We are still waiting. But we also have studied our legal possibilities while presenting documentation to put more pressure on the government to comply. The problem is not religious persecution, but incompetence. It is our prayer that we will soon be announcing good news on that matter. We have already ordered and paid for three transmitters for these stations.

Meanwhile, we have a lot of great news in other areas. We have purchased another license for just under \$3,000. The permit is for the area located in the northern tip of Peru. It will be a station with lower power, but the signal will reach into Colombia and Brazil. We call this project "*Three Borders*". Leticia is the city located on the Colombian side. This city is filled with drug traffickers.

We also learned of an opportunity to buy more licenses directly from private radio owners. Upon purchase, the transaction would be easier and broadcasting would be as fast as we can get the equipment in place. Pray the Lord will guide and provide for what He ordains. It is exciting to see how God is opening doors with golden opportunities to saturate the country with the gospel. We work closely with independent Baptist churches in the area where each station is located.
