

TAJIMAS SERVING WITH BAPTIST MID-MISSIONS
IN JAPAN UPDATE May to June 2019

Dear Praying Friends of the Tajimas,

Greetings in our precious Savior's name!

We have had some troubles with our computer (Windows 7). Even had hackers getting into our computer (later I found it out through our provider). So we were unable to send our prayer letter to supporters through the computer. Now we are praying for a new computer for that purpose. Some of our friends, missionaries, told me that Apple is far better because Windows service will end every three or four years, and we will need to renew or update the computer. So I went to the store to check how much for the Apple Computer. It costs around \$1700. So would you pray for this need?

Now about Nobby's health, He has finished the 4th round and TWO more to go. Each round takes about 3 weeks – 5 days of chemo-therapy and 5 days of shots to replenish white corpuses' and then the doctor waits to see how the treatment works in the following week. He's lost almost 37 pounds since he started chemo-treatment in February. But he feels fine and has not lost his appetite nor is experiencing nausea or throwing up. Good medicine? Yes, but more soothing is the prayers of people from all over, and Bev's care. I know she has been tired but she visits me every day, bringing water since I need to drink at least a quart a day. They are heavy to carry but she has been doing so. I thank the Lord. I will go back to the hospital on June 24th and stay there for three weeks at least. My heart condition is pretty good after that triple bypass operation in March. God spared my life which means I have some things to do for Him. The doctor allowed me to take two weeks off this time so I could attend the Bible Conference and graduation in June 11-13. Two of the precious guys graduated and one may go back to his own area and the other one will stay and continue to study. And also, another auditing student, who is 72 years old, wants to continue to study. We as the Bible School Board thought and decided to start newly as Grace Baptist College from this September. Three teachers, not including Nobby, will teach various subjects. I was asked by the principal to go back to teach in the second year. So pray that my strength will be back by then.

New prayer requests:

1. Nobby's chemo treatment (two more times) One starts on June 24th.
2. Cemetery Committee on June 17,18th – BMM in Japan is automatically a chairman of that committee since that property is owned by BMM of Japan legally.
3. Pray for our son, Daniel, to make sure his salvation. He is the only one not baptized even though I do not believe baptism is for salvation.
4. Sarah, our second daughter, may make certain decisions in the future.
5. Our youngest daughter, Stephanie's husband, Yuta, may get saved. He attends church at least twice a month.
6. Baptism for Mr. & Mrs. Shirakawa.
7. Need for the computer as I mentioned above.

8. Our monthly need of support - \$1700
9. Family Camp – Aug.12-15 which Nobby will assist.
10. From September, we will start a new plan for door to door to visitation
11. Grace Baptist College will start in September
12. Visas for the Thompsons (should come before July 20 since they got tickets of July 23rd)
13. The Gonnermans' language study
14. Healing of Rev. Haruta of Himeji BC – he has lymphoma tumors right behind his eyes. One of them was removed but the other tumor is too big so far to do so.
