#### **GOODNESS**

Of all virtues and dignities of the mind, goodness is the greatest, being the character of the Deity; and without it, man is a busy, mischievous, wretched thing. Francis Bacon

Let us then be ever mindful of our dependence upon the Spirit of God. We derived our new life from Him and only He can maintain it in us. Without Him we can neither think good thoughts, speak good words, not do good deeds.

George Washington Bethune

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light" and there was light. And God saw the light **that it was good**; and God divided the light from the darkness. Genesis 1: 1-4

Here is the first time we see the word "Good" in the English Bible and we see that God Himself is pronouncing the work of His Hand and Creative Power as good. In the New Testament we hear from the lips of Jesus the Son of God speaking to a rich young ruler.

"Why do you call me good? No one is good but One, that is God.
"Matthew 19: 17

We see that true goodness is the essence of the character of God Himself. He alone is *truly good* and He alone produces *truly good things*. By His indwelling Spirit, we too can walk in His goodness and be a doer of good. Let's dig into this month's fruit of the Spirit....Goodness.

"This word means goodness, generosity.

It is being full of -virtue and excellence,

-kindness and helpfulness,

-peace and consideration.

This word means that a person **is full of all good** and he **does all good**. This word means that the one who possesses goodness...

- has a good heart and good behavior.
- is good and does good
- is a quality person" [Practical Word Studies in the New Testament]

Knowing that God Himself is Goodness and thus the standard by which all other goodness is measured, it would follow that the behaviors that would display goodness must be an echo of God's goodness.

Let's look up some Old Testament Scriptures and note what God calls good.

### Side Note:

All of these references uses the Hebrew Word:"tobe"
This is the same word used in the Genesis account when God pronounced the Creation as "good'. In other words it pleased Him.

Working backwards....in these verses...if we would desire to **Walk in the Way of Goodness** (v. 20), we need to have wisdom in our heart and the knowledge of God needs to be pleasant to our souls. This wisdom and knowledge of the things of God will give us discretion and understanding which in turn protects and preserves us from evil. (v. 10-12).

We obtain this wisdom and knowledge by some specific and intentional actions/ attitudes: (v. 1-4)

- Receiving the Word of God (v. 1)
- Treasuring/ Esteeming God's commands (v. 1)
- Inclining our ear to wisdom (v.2) listening to the teaching of His Word
- Applying our hearts to understanding (v.2) Studying God's Word
- Crying out for discernment (v.3) Praying to God
- Lifting up our voice for understanding (v.3) Asking God
- Diligent and careful search for the wisdom of God (v. 4)
- Fear the Lord (v.5) **Reverence God, seek to please Him in all we do and say.**

IN the New Testament we have a group of related Greek words that express the meaning of Good/Goodness.

Let's start with 'agathe" which means good, useful, beneficial, best, excellent, devoted and given to truth.

Let's look at a portion of Scripture where" agathe" appears. Turn to Luke 8: 5-15 and read the parable of the Sower and the Seed.

What is the first thing to be called "good" in this portion?	
Why was it deemed good?	
What did this object represent?	
How did these types of hearers show that they had "good" hearts?	

Another variation of this Greek word is "agathas".

According to the Practical Word Studies in the New Testament, *agathas* means kind, good, useful, high quality, virtuous through and through, good natured and caring.

This word is used in the following Scriptures:

the older women likewise, that they be reverent in behavior, not slanderers, not given to much wine, teachers of <code>good</code> things— that they admonish the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, to be discreet, chaste, homemakers, <code>good</code>, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be blasphemed.

(Titus 2:3-5 NKJV)

What are some of the good things that the older women are to teach the younger women?

What types of character traits do the older women need to display in order to even qualify them to be teachers to the younger women?

Do not let a widow under sixty years old be taken into the number, and not
unless she has been the wife of one man, well reported for good works: if
she has brought up children, if she has lodged strangers, if she has washed
the saints' feet, if she has relieved the afflicted, if she has diligently followed
every good work.

(1 Timothy 5:9-10 NKJV)

What are some of the good works that are listed in this portion of Scripture?

Look at the contrast to this type of woman with a woman who is not of a good reputation that is described a few verses later.

Besides that, they learn to be idlers, going about from house to house, and not only idlers, but also gossips and busybodies, saying what they should not.

Based on these descriptions, take some time and imagine a Woman who displays the trait of Goodness in her life. Write a descriptive paragraph of this good woman.

Acts 9:36-42.

Tabitha is said to have been "full of good works and charitable deeds" Using what we learned from the other Scriptures we studied in previous pages and from looking at v. 39, what type of things do you think Tabitha did with the time, energy and talents God had given her?

Her life was so full of goodness, usefulness to others and service to the Lord that the other disciples in her community could not imagine their group without her help and presence. Even after sickness had taken her life they hoped and prayed that the Apostle Peter might be able to come and raise her up. Imagine how amazing this woman was that she would be missed so greatly by her church family.
This account is a sweet and tender account of a life well lived in the Spirit of Goodness. Tabitha's legacy prompts us to contemplate what contributions we are making with this life we have been given by God.

# The Holy Scriptures unequivocally speak of an expectation of "Goodness" in the life of the believer.
