Well here we are looking at the 8th manifestation of the Fruit of the Spirit. We have arrived at Gentleness. In many translations including the KJV, the word here for gentleness is translated as "meekness". For the purposes of our study we will explore these words and their various forms in both the Old and New Testament.

Gentleness and Leadership

Gentleness and the Believer

In keeping with our Savior, we are called to be gentle and meek people in whatever role God has called us to. I thoroughly believe that we are all a leader to someone...it might be our kids, our students, our friends, our siblings etc. Read the following verses and then highlight the reference to this fruit of the Spirit in each exhortation.

Nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, when we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, just as a nursing mother cherishes her own children. (1 Thessalonians 2:6-7 NKJV)

Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men. (Titus 3:1-2 NKJV)

And a servant of the Lord must not quarrel but be gentle to all, able to teach, patient, in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth, (2 Timothy 2:24-25 NKJV)

Do not let your adornment be merely outward—arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel—rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God. (1 Peter 3:3-4 NKJV)

But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear; (1 Peter 3:15 NKJV)

But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy. (James 3:17 NKJV)

Gentleness Is About Others
