From the Pastor

I'm doing one of my favorite things through the first few weeks of the new year—reading a book of the Bible (the gospel of John) with someone who's seeking the Lord. The person is a young immigrant, a brilliant young graduate student who's finishing up an advanced degree at our local university. He's been coming to our church lately and took the initiative of asking to meet with me.

We'll read a chapter or three then talk. Just that. No preaching (not an easy thing for a preacher), no academic lectures, little theology. Just the Word of God speaking into our hearts. I've been following this pattern for years and have learned that God can speak for himself better than I can, so I try to guide our conversations so that my new friend can listen to what God is saying. My prayer in all these conversations is that the people I meet with will come to a personal faith in Jesus. They often do.

There are many other ways to share faith, of course. And that's why we're focusing in 2020 on "For the One," a challenge to all our church family taken from the parable of the lost sheep in Luke

15:4 which calls us to "go after the one who is lost." That means to find creative and effective ways to invite others into a saving relationship with Jesus and a meaningful connection with His church. Who's in your life right now that needs to hear the good news of the gospel—what family member, friend or neighbor who needs to hear about Jesus?

Let's make a different kind of New Year's resolution this year. Instead of focusing on our own desires, needs or opportunities, why don't we focus on the spiritual lostness of the people around us? Why don't we decide at the very first part of this year to pull our testimony out of hiding and be more forthcoming about sharing it with the people around us?

I'm excited about Sunday mornings to start the new year. Through the month of January, I'll be preaching a sermon series called, "Restored: How God Brings Your Life into Alignment with His Will." I believe these messages will be an encouragement to many, so I hope you'll plan on being here and bringing someone with you who needs to hear!

For my Refresh Bible study on Wednesday nights in January I'll be leading a special teaching on "Heart Healthy"—a series on the central role the heart plays in our relationship with Jesus and how important it is for us to guard our hearts for Him alone.

Finally, our next Lunch with the Pastor is Sunday, January 26 following the second service. If you or someone you know wants more information about the awesome things the Lord is doing here at LBC, go to our website and register (the lunch is free and there's free child care). 

As we come into this new year, I challenge every one of us to reach out to that one person. Invite them to Sunday worship with you. Invite them to serve with you. Flip through the pages of this Signal and pick from the countless Bible Studies, activities and Wednesday night classes to invite them to. If everyone will "go after the one who is lost" (Luke 15:4), soon we'll all have our own stories of new brothers and sisters in Christ. What a glorious day that will be!


