A Message From the Elders

If we wish to win the eternal battle it is time to challenge ourselves to build our hopes on the Lord Jesus Christ. Our families need to see Jesus as Head over all things. And finally, we must build our schedules and lives on that which brings strength to the spiritual house.


How Each Member Can Rise Up and Build

WHAT IS HEAVEN WORTH TO YOU?



Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. Like any construction project, after the design is finished, we immediately begin to see the value of what we are building. What we build spiritually in life will lead to the ultimate reward: heaven. We yearn for a place where God dwells, where we will be His people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away, Revelation 21.3.

Construction BUILDING YOUR LIFE AROUND JESUS



As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

- 2 Peter 2.4-5

How do we construct our spiritual life? What steps can we take to get to the next level? This quarter will be a time for reflection and self inspection. Paul wrote, *Examine yourselves*, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves, 2 Corinthians 13.5. How about you? Now is the time to act on the plan you devise. Build with a sense of urgency because salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light, Romans 13.11b-12.

Over the summer months, we will focus specifically on the most important areas of life: family relationships, career choices, and the church. We will be reminded of the activity of Satan as he attempts to distract and discourage as we work on the project. How can we effectively resist his efforts to destabilize our home and family? How can we build a lasting spiritual legacy?

Our summer series will focus on the tremendous challenge Israel faced once they returned from the exile. How did they respond in building the walls of Jerusalem? What challenges do we face today and how will we respond? Is Jesus the cornerstone you are building on?, Ephesians 2.20.



How Can I Become a Better Builder?

As we build on the foundation of Christ, each member of our Kettering family should think about ways to become more efficient and effective at construction. What things can you do to be a better builder? Here are 12 ideas you should focus on:

- 1. **Understand the project**. We build for one purpose and that is to glorify God with our lives so that one day we can see Him face to face.
- 2. Become a real student of the project manual. Reading the Bible is good, studying it is better, and meditating on its applications moves you from a common laborer to a wise master builder.
- 3. Begin with demolition. The only way to build the Lord's house is to destroy whatever impedes construction. Are there boulders blocking your worksite? Do you need to remove pieces of construction that do not belong in the structure? Are there areas in your life that prevent blowing them up or tearing them down?
- 4. Don't be sloppy as you build. Keep your tools clean and the area presentable. Clutter on the construction site leads to other laborers falling and being injured. Always remember you are not the only one building so be careful about your tools and the area you are working on.
- 5. Help others with their project. Jesus took the 12 with Him as He laid the foundation to build His church. Not only was it His task to build His church, but those with Him needed to know how to build properly once His work was finished. What are your actions teaching future builders?
- **6. Work as if the project needs to be completed tomorrow.** If you are not diligent in working, the project may lose its importance. Many start to build, but never finish. Completion is urgent to prevent weakness in your structure.
- 7. Always look for remodeling ideas. Construction may be complete in some ares, but your house always needs a new coat of paint, a room remodeled, or a room added on. Be a builder who never stops expanding or repairing the project.

- 9. Be careful of those who would delay the project. It is your job to make sure that the job site is protected. Leaving tools and materials unguarded gives the enemy the ability to make sure the project is always in trouble. When trouble comes, always be ready to rebuild.
- **10. Go to work every day.** Those who always find a reason not to get up and go often find they are never successful in building anything.
- 11. Depend on good help. You are never alone. If there are areas you are struggling in, don't forget there are other builders around who have that strength. Learn to depend on your brothers and sisters in Christ.
- **12. Build it as if God were moving in.** Give attention to detail, and strive for quality in the way you build your spiritual life. Are you giving God your best?


