WHAT IS THIS GUIDE?

The season of Lent comes to a stunning close with Holy Week. This season of withdrawing with Jesus into the wilderness of suffering wears on us. Holy Week walks us through the last days of King Jesus, centers our attention on the cross, & explodes into joyous celebration at this great truth: Jesus Christ is risen; He is risen indeed! This guide serves to anchor us in Christ daily in scripture, prayer, & practices that prepare our hearts for Resurrection Sunday. The daily scripture readings are divided into morning & evening readings, & will be laid out like this:

PRAYER AND PRACTICES

Each day, we will have written **prayers** to accompany our scripture readings & to prompt us in our own time of reflection with God. Following the Scripture reading & prayer, there will be a **practice** designed to engage our whole selves in worship - body, mind, heart, & soul. They are **simple**, & are meant only as a **guide**, not a prescription. so there is much freedom to **enjoy** God, his word, & his presence each day as we march toward the **resurrection** of **King Jesus**.

HOLY WEEK 2020 | MONDAY



MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
ISAIAH 42:1-9	HEBREWS 9:11-15
PSALM 36:5-11	JOHN 12:1-11
PRAYER:	
Christ our God, your love is poured out in death for our sakes. Keep us in your Presence as we wait for Easter's dawn. Comfort us with the promise that no power on earth, not even death itself, can separate us from your love; & strengthen us to worship you with our every breath until you are revealed to us in all your risen glory.	
Amen.	

PRACTICE: BREATH PRAYER

Each day this week, we are orienting ourselves around the **epicenter of the gospel:** the crucifixion, death, & resurrection of **Jesus**. He is our hope, our life. Today, practice focusing on Jesus by doing **breath prayers**: make time (seconds or minutes) to get alone, still, & quiet. Breathe in through your nose, & out through your mouth. As you exhale, whisper the name, "**Jesus**."

HOLY WEEK 2020 | TUESDAY

mystery of reconciliation.

The entire book of **Psalms** is a collection of **Songs of Worship**. Over & over we are told to **sing** to the Lord. We see from the story of King Jehoshaphat in **2 Chronicles 20** that praise is powerful in defeating the enemies of God (Psalm 98:1; Psalm 68). Pop in your headphones & sing along with Spotify or join with family & friends. Psalm 96:1 says, "Sing to the Lord a new song." Celebrate that God has heard every prayer.

HOLY WEEK 2020 | WEDNESDAY



MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
ISAIAH 50:4-9a	HEBREWS 12:1-3
PSALM 70	JOHN 13:21-32
PRAYER:	
God our strength , we lift to you the deepest prayers of our hearts that you will save us from the time of trial & comfort us in tribulation . Reveal your glory to our hearts and the nations , that your cross may stand as a sign of the power that conquers human pride & confounds the wisdom of this world.

PRACTICE: INTERCESSORY PRAYER

In intercession, we contend for God to move on someone else's behalf (Romans 15:30; 1 Timothy 2:1-2). Identify the situations, areas of culture, or groups of people for whom you are asking for spiritual awakening, & pray for them. For example, we can pray for salvation in our neighborhoods with 2 Thess. 3:1: "Jesus, let your Gospel be preached & received well!"

HOLY WEEK 2020 | MAUNDY THURSDAY

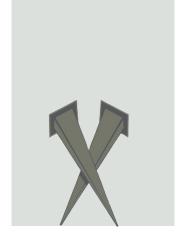


MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
EXODUS 12:1-42	1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-26
PSALM 116	JOHN 13:1-17, 31-35
PRAYER:	
Faithful God, as you delivered the Hebrews safely out of the long labor of slavery, so, morning by morning , you draw us forth into the new day. Surround us with a cloud of witnesses , & sustain us by your powerful word , that, in the night of loneliness & fear , we, being weary, may not lose heart but push toward the joy that is to come, laboring with Christ to give birth to your promised kingdom .

PRACTICE: COMMUNION

This day in Holy Week was when **Jesus** shared his last meal with his disciples & instituted the sacrament of **communion**. In our homes today, let us join together with Christ's **global church** by sharing in this **bread & cup**. In this fragmented time, these elements turn our attention to communing **with God & others**, though we are at a distance. As we eat and drink, we remember: **we are not alone**. We belong to Christ & to one other. **Do this**, if possible, in virtual community **with others**.

HOLY WEEK 2020 | GOOD FRIDAY



MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
ISAIAH 52:13-53:12	HEBREWS 4:14-16; 5:7-9
PSALM 22	JOHN 18:1-19:42
PRAYER:	

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, & deed, by what we have done & by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We grieve our transgressions & in humility, we repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will & walk in your ways to the glory of your Name.

Amen.

PRACTICE: CONFESSION

Sin brings **death**. Our body, mind, heart, & soul are all broken by our sin condition. Yet, the **good news** of the gospel is that the crucifixion of Jesus is the center of the **healing** of the whole world. The prophet Isaiah says, by Christ's **wounds**, we are **healed**. Make time to confess your sin, acknowledge the ways it has brought sickness and pain, & ask God to heal you—body, mind, heart, & soul.

HOLY WEEK 2020 | HOLY SATURDAY



MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
LAMENTATIONS 3:1-9, 19-24	HEBREWS 10:16-25
PSALM 31:1-4, 15-16	MATTHEW 27:57-66

PRACTICE: PRAYER OF EXAMEN (FROM IGNATIUS OF LOYALA)

At the heart of this practice is becoming **aware** of God's **presence** & **movement** throughout our days. Make time to get alone in quiet, ideally sometime later in the day; it helps to have a journal or maybe go for a walk. There are 5 parts in this modified version:

- **Preparation (Psalm 63:1):** Still your heart & minimize distractions.
- **Gratitude (Psalm 107:1):** Consider who God is in his character & nature; think about his goodness & blessings.
- Awareness (2 Cor. 13:5): Two sets of questions: 1) Where did I feel most alive, most hopeful, most in the presence of God? What filled, fulfilled, & energized me? 2) Where did I feel most dead, most despairing, furthest from God? What left me drained?
- Confession (Psalm 103:12): This is more than just acknowledging sin; this is a moment to receive God's forgiveness & grace.
- Renewal (Psalm 104:33-35): Look forward to the days and weeks ahead (meetings, commitments, and responsibilities) & plan to live in light of God's presence & grace.

HOLY WEEK 2020 | RESURRECTION SUNDAY



MORNING SCRIPTURE:	EVENING SCRIPTURE:
ISAIAH 25:6-9	ACTS 10:34-43
PSALM 118	JOHN 20:1-18
PRAYER:	
Resurrecting God, in whom we know the power of redemption , you stand among us in the shadows of our time. As we move through every sorrow & trial of this life, uphold us with knowledge of the final morning when, in the glorious presence of your risen Son, we will share in his resurrection, redeemed & restored to the fullness of life & forever freed to be your people.	
Amen!	

PRACTICE: PRAYER WALK

Jesus taught us to pray, "Our Father in heaven, may your Kingdom come and your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Prayer walking invites us to slow down, to walk the streets we usually pass quickly in our cars, and to pray that God's Kingdom and will flood our streets, bringing with them the love, joy, and peace of Christ.
