While we are all in a hurry to get this year over with, let's not hurry through December. We have some significant experiences ahead that we hope will deeply touch people with God's love, presence, hope and light.

- **One of the more painful losses in the pandemic** is the fact that many people did not get the chance to attend memorial services for loved ones and friends. Our **SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE** gives those who have lost loved ones the opportunity not only to grieve but to remember them in a very special service. This service will be held on Saturday, December 5 at 3:00pm in the Worship Center (see page 4).
- **There is our NIGHT IN BETHLEHEM DRIVE-THRU NATIVITY.** Our Kids Ministry has come up with a great way to hold a traditional and much-loved event, while modifying it for COVID. The drive-thru will not only tell the story of Christ's birth, but will provide take-home crafts for kids to do with their family. This event will be held on Sunday, December 13 from 6:30-8:00pm (see page 4).
- **And while we can't have in-person Christmas concerts,** our Worship Arts staff and Media Team have come up with a creative and brilliant "work-around." They are bringing us "**A THRILL OF HOPE,**" **an online Christmas concert.** It will include soloists, ensembles, readings, and even our 30-member choir! We know you will love it and we hope it will help make your Christmas more Christ-filled. We plan on posting the concert on the website and app on Friday, December 11 (see page 5).
- **Finally,** we will hold in-person **CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES.** Due to our seating restrictions we are expanding the nights and the number of services we normally have. We will have 3 services on December 23 and four services on December 24. The services will include singing, special music, a message, communion, and "*Silent Night*" by candlelight on the courtyard. Registration for seating at these services will begin December 15. A recording of the service will be available on our website and app on December 24 for people who cannot attend in-person.

So, whether in-person or online, take advantage of these opportunities to experience God's presence and love, and better prepare for and celebrate Christmas. I hope these great moments bring lasting joy and peace to you and help us all to end a difficult year on a very high and wonderful note!

MISSIONS Update

In spite of the COVID-19 pandemic, Centerpoint is faithfully continuing to support our global mission partners. Although Centerpoint is not currently sending teams out, our Global Missions Outreach Team (GMOT) continues to meet, supporting our global partners in prayer and financially helping them serve their communities and organizations.

Centerpoint's global mission partners also continue to serve their communities. GMOT recently received a request for funds from Aloys Ntamugabuwme, senior pastor of Masaka Baptist Church in Uganda, Africa. He asked for help to complete a two-room building that will serve as a vocational training center for area youth. The funding request came via Hope Alive!, our Uganda mission partner, which is helping Masaka Baptist Church arrange the needed funding. GMOT unanimously voted approval of \$1,900 to assist with completion of the vocational building at Masaka Baptist Church.


Centerpoint sent a short-term mission team to serve the Masaka community in January 2017. Our team served with Hope Alive! and Masaka Baptist Church, where Centerpoint's team did their workshops and worshipped with the community. Masaka Baptist Church was very hospitable, and it is an honor and pleasure to donate funds to complete a building that will be used by so many as a step for future careers glorifying God.

Centerpoint recently received the following thank you letter from Pastor Aloys:

Warm greetings to you. On behalf of Masaka Baptist Church I gratefully send this appreciation message to the Centerpoint Community Church for standing with us in supporting our skills center construction. We have received on the church account an amount totaling 13,832,000 Ugandan shillings.

It is a pleasure that they still stand with us in training the church people and hopefully we pray that they will come back. For the building, God willing, we hope to open it by early 2021. Once again thank you to Catherine Coon, Hope Alive! Executive Director, for the continued support and love you have for our church and the entire community through Masaka Baptist Church and Hope Alive! We humbly say thank you much and God always bless you more and more.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR NANCY:

Recently I led a Zoom training session for our new deacons who will start serving in January. We looked together at Acts 6:1-7, which describes how the deacon ministry began in the early church. A particular group of widows – those who spoke a different language – had been falling through the cracks in their food distribution ministry, and people had started complaining. The twelve disciples responded to this crisis by inviting the church to choose seven godly people from among them to take over leadership of this care ministry. The result was surprising: there's no mention of the widows being fed – that's just assumed. Instead, Acts 6:7 says that through this, the word of God spread and the number of disciples increased rapidly. God used a ministry of compassion to draw others to himself.

At that time, the early church numbered more than 3,000. Seven servant leaders couldn't possibly cover the care needs of that many people. But their leadership empowered the entire church to provide for needs in concrete ways. That's what our Centerpoint deacons do. They lead the church in ministries of care and compassion towards those in our church family and community. Deacons do the planning and organizing that is needed to provide holiday food baskets, prayer partners and prayer teams, meals, cards, crisis care financial assistance, calls to homebound, handyman help – the list goes on and on. Our deacons are amazing servant leaders, who have worked cheerfully and creatively to reshape ministries in ways that work in this time of pandemic. But the deacons can't do it all – nor do they have to! You, the members of our Centerpoint family, are amazing volunteers in all these ministries of compassion. And God is using your caring service to draw others to himself. It is a privilege for me to support the deacons as they lead you in these ministries. Thank you!

Our deacons are amazing servant leaders, who have worked cheerfully and creatively to reshape ministries in ways that work in this time of pandemic.
