Small Group Questions
For the week of December 19, 2021

Icebreaker:

What makes your favorite Christmas hymn your favorite Christmas hymn? What do you love about it? Is it the lyrics, the tune, a memory attached to the song?

Discussion Questions:

1. Review: what do you remember about the history of this hymn?
2. This Sunday, we lit the Advent candle of love. Where do you see the theme of love woven into this hymn?
3. In the hymn, "Oh Come, All Ye Faithful," we are invited to visualize ourselves going to Bethlehem. The hymn claims we can go joyfully and triumphantly. Do those feelings resonate with you? Are you feeling triumphant, or are you feeling more defeated than triumphant? How can you remain honest with your feelings and circumstances in life and still be joyful and triumphant?
4. Search online for the Nicene Creed. Compare it to the stanzas of "Oh Come, All Ye Faithful." Do you see similarities? How does this enrich the hymn for you as a Christian?
5. Read Mary's Song found in Luke 1:46-55. Based on her words, why do you think God chose her to be Jesus' mother? How is she worthy? How does she show faithfulness?

A Call to Action:

6. How can your small group at Centerpoint show adoration for Jesus this Christmas season?
7. How can you personally show adoration for Jesus this Christmas season?
8. What action can you add to this Advent season to glorify God? Where could you step outside of your comfort zone?
9. How does showing adoration for Jesus also point others towards Christ's approach?
