INTRODUCTION

The Scriptures command us to nurture our children in the training and instruction of the Lord. The Apostle Paul writes: "Fathers do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4 NIV) The Old Testament, likewise, requires this sort of intentional passing on of biblical instruction. "These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates." (Deuteronomy 6:6-9 NIV) In other words, we are not only to immerse ourselves in the teaching of God's Word, but we are to do it in such a way that God's truth rubs off onto our children. God's Word ought to be and, indeed is, contagious.

The reality is, however, that for most of us this seems like an overwhelming task. Many ask: "Practically speaking, how do I do this? Where do I begin?" I find that there are many parents who are desirous of training their children in the Gospel, but fewer that are confident in knowing how to do this. Therefore, it is with a view to helping you teach your children that this tool is given. This devotional guide is specifically intended to assist you in that task of teaching your children the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

To those without small children, I would also like to add that this material should be just as helpful for you to teach yourself basic doctrine, etc. as it would be for parents to teach their kids. We are all called to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul and mind. It is difficult if not impossible to love one that we do not know or do not know well. Therefore, if you do not already have a plan for growing in your knowledge of Christ and His Word, I would encourage you to make the most of the memory work and readings given here.

FORMAT

This guide is divided into weekly lessons. Each lesson includes a basic and an advanced catechism question, a Scripture reading plan, and a hymn. The goal is to start each lesson on Sunday and complete it by the following Sunday. You may start with "Week One" at any point in the year; however, it is recommended that you begin "Week One" on the fourth Sunday in September. That would allow the congregation to work through the guide together.

BASIC CATECHISM

Over the centuries catechisms were the traditional way of teaching the Christian faith. From Roman Catholics to Lutherans to Baptists, it was the accepted means of passing on the faith to new converts and to the next generation. There was sound reason for this. The simple question-answer format of catechisms facilitated their memorization and thereby inculcated the basic building blocks of a truly Christian mind. Unfortunately, over the past hundred years or so, nearly every Christian tradition and denomination abandoned the priority of catechetical teaching for its children. The reasons seem to be that they were swayed by the notion that such rote memorization was too crude a form of education and that knowledge of doctrine really did not matter much anyway.

It is our opinion that this trend has been disastrous for the church, not to mention the state of biblical knowledge in the broader culture. It is our prayer that the use of this material will prove helpful in reversing the current malaise of doctrinal ignorance among professing Christians and their children.

The Basic Catechism included in this guide is a standard children's catechism that has been edited and appended to bring greater clarification to the Gospel. It is intended to be used with children 3rd Grade and younger. We strongly encourage that the children, as well as the parents, commit these questions and answers to memory.

SAMPLE:

BASIC CATECHISM Revelation 4:11

Who made you? God.

What else did God make? God made all things.

Why did God make all things? For His own pleasure and glory.

One more thing: the Scripture references found next to the *Basic Catechism* heading are recommended Scripture memory verses for the week.

ADVANCED CATECHISM

The Advanced Catechism is an adaptation of Spurgeon's Catechism, the catechism compiled by the famous 19th century British preacher/pastor Charles Haddon Spurgeon. Spurgeon himself had taken a version of the Westminster Shorter Catechism (1647) and adapted it to his contemporary situation. In the same way, this catechism is an adaptation of Spurgeon's, borrowing material from such places as Martin Luther's Smaller Catechism as well as some original editing for the purpose of further clarifying the Gospel message.

I recommend that the advanced catechism be used with children who are fourth grade and older, though younger children may stand to benefit, providing that there is further explanation. As you can see from the sample below, Scripture references are included in the text of the catechism for further study.

SAMPLE:

ADVANCED CATECHISM

What is the chief purpose of man? Man's chief purpose is to glorify God (1Cor.10:31) and to enjoy him forever. (Ps. 73:25, 26)

Some may object to the "big words" that are used in this catechism. First, it should be noted that the fact that we think these are "big words" is evidence of how far we have fallen culturally in our biblical/theological knowledge. As mentioned earlier, this catechism finds its roots in the Westminster Shorter Catechism, which was THE standard catechism across our nation up until the last century. It had been used in a variety of forms by Congregationalists, Presbyterians, Baptist, and many Episcopalians to teach their youngest children the faith. In drawing on this tradition we are seeking to raise the standard once again in educating our children. In this case educating them means exposing them to things of which we are ignorant, such as these words and concepts. Certainly over the years it is our duty as parents to help explain the meaning of these things. However, if they are not first exposed to them, how will they ever learn their meaning?

SCRIPTURE READING

The importance of reading Scripture cannot be underestimated. The method outlined in this section will allow the reader to work systematically through God's word in the space of three years (each row representing the respective year of progress through this family devotional guide).

The six columns generally represent different genre of biblical literature: Law/History, Psalms, Wisdom, Prophets, Gospel/Acts, NT Letters (respectively). Since there are six readings for each week, this would allow daily readings with one day off per week.

There are two suggested settings for reading the Scripture as a family. First, you may find it helpful to read a chapter before a family meal. This actually could lead to a fruitful discussion over the dinner table. Families with older children may allow them to participate in the reading. Another suggestion is to read it at bedtime. For those with younger children, you may want to simply read to them as they fall asleep.

HYMNS

A hymn has been included for each week, not only as a way to worship but also as a way to learn doctrine. Over the years you and your children will not regret committing these historic declarations of God's greatness and goodness to memory.

A good hymn is the explosion of a heart that has been captivated by the greatness of God and the good news of His kindness toward us through His Son. Some of the church's most beautifully articulated doctrine is found in her hymns. One can hardly think of "A Mighty Fortress is Our God" by Martin Luther, "Hark the Herald Angels" by Charles Wesley or "All Creatures of Our God and King" by St. Francis, without being irresistibly drawn to ponder, adore and worship the One of whom they speak. Hymns are both the kindling and fire of worship.

GENERAL COMMENTS TO PARENTS

Finally, a few general comments are in order. First, this guide is not a "one size fits all" curriculum. Everyone is different. Therefore, you will need to adjust it to the needs and personality of you and your children. Some children may need to begin slowly and therefore you might choose to implement just a few selections from the suggested weekly teaching. Other children may be able to tackle the entire week's teaching and perhaps even go beyond it. Regardless of what level your child is at, my advice is that you do something and that you do it consistently.

Second, I must stress that this tool is not intended to "educate" your child into the kingdom of God. Repentance and faith in Christ are not merely an issue of acquiring information. Entrance into the kingdom of God can only come through the new birth. It is a miracle of God. In the words of Jesus, "You must be born again." (John 3:7)

Having said this, however, it is clear from Scripture that God works through means in the conversion of sinners. Our faith in Christ is not produced in a vacuum but rather in a context where we hear the message of Christ proclaimed (Romans 10:13-17). "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ." It is for this reason that He calls us to *proclaim* the good news. Accordingly, we must communicate the rudiments of the Gospel to our children and subsequently call them to repentance. This guide simply provides a method for that process.

Finally, I feel it necessary also to warn that this tool is not intended to be used as a way of "forcing" our children into the kingdom. Remember you are dealing with *children*. Patience and persistent love are the order of the day. Remember that in parenting the old dictum rings especially true: "Your talk talks, and your walk talks. But your walk talks better than your talk talks." Your children are more likely to become what *you are* and not what you tell them to be or what you try to force them to become. If the truth be told, you, as a parent, will likely learn far more from teaching this material than your children will learn from being taught. Perhaps, this is the way it ought to be.

What do the Scriptures principally teach? The Scriptures principally teach what God requires of His creatures and how Jesus Christ has fulfilled that requirement on behalf of all who trust Him. (Luke 24:44-49; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; 1 Timothy 1:15)

No. Although parents have the serious responsibility to nurture their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord, (Eph. 6:4) we must be careful not to presume upon the sovereign work of the Spirit (John 3:3-8; Matt. 3:7-10). The Church, unlike Old Testament Israel, is comprised of those born of the Spirit and not of mere physical descent. (John 1:12-13; Ez. 36:26; Matt. 3:9; Ro. 9)

APPENDIX: HISTORIC CREEDS OF THE CHURCH

APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in GOD THE FATHER Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth;

And in JESUS CHRIST, his only-begotten SON, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the HOLY SPIRIT; the holy catholic Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one GOD THE FATHER Almighty; Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;

And in one LORD JESUS CHRIST, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontious Pilate. He suffered and was buried, and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead, whose kingdom shall have no end.

And we believe in the HOLY SPIRIT, the Lord and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And we believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

CREED OF CHALCEDON

We, then, following the holy Fathers, all with one consent, teach men to confess one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, the same perfect in Godhead and also perfect in manhood; truly God and truly man, of a reasonable [rational] soul and body; consubstantial [co-essential] with the Father according to the Godhead, and consubstantial with us according to

the Manhood; in all things like unto us, without sin; begotten before all ages of the Father according to the Godhead, and in these latter days, for us and for our salvation, born of the Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, according to the Manhood; one and the same Christ, Son, Lord, Only begotten, to be acknowledged in two natures, inconfusedly, unchangeably, indivisibly, inseparably; the distinction of natures being by no means taken away by the unity, but rather the property of each nature being preserved, and concurring in one Person and one Subsistence, not parted or divided into two persons, but one and the same Son, and only begotten, God the Word, the Lord Jesus Christ; as the prophets from the beginning [have declared] concerning him, and the Lord Jesus Christ himself has taught us, and the Creed of the holy Fathers has handed down to us.

THE ATHANASIAN CREED

Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in three persons and three person in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.

For each person-the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit-is distinct, but the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal; yet they are not three who are eternal, but one who is eternal,

just as there are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

In the same way

the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty; yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;

yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.
For just as Christian truth compels us to confess

each person individually to be God and Lord

so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone.

The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten,

but proceeds from the Father and the Son.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers;
one Son not three Sons;
one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And within this Trinity none comes before or after;
none is greater or inferior,
but all three persons are coequal and coeternal,
so that in every way, as stated before,
all three persons are to be worshiped as one God
and one God worshiped as three persons.

Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.
It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation
truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.
Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh,

equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the Father as to his humanity; and though he is both God and man, Christ is not two persons but one, one, not by changing the deity into flesh,

but by taking the humanity into God;

one, indeed, not by mixture of the nature, but by unity in one person; for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there will come to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all people will rise with their own bodies to answer for their personal deeds.

Those who have done good will enter eternal life, but those who have done evil will go into eternal fire.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.
