

STONES of FAITH



CONVERSATION

Stephen Preached

ACTS 6:8-7

Stephen was a man in the early church who had great faith and power. He loved God and believed Jesus was the Savior God had promised to send.

Stephen had an important message. He told people about Jesus and began to do miracles among the people.

Some of the Jews were angry. They did not like what Stephen said, especially when he talked about Jesus, and they argued with Stephen. God gave Stephen such wisdom that he won every argument! The Jews enlisted other men to lie about Stephen. "We have heard Stephen say bad things about God," the liars told the people. These liars stirred up the crowd, and the people dragged Stephen before the Jewish leaders.

As the men continued to lie about Stephen in front of the religious leaders, people saw that Stephen's face looked like an angel.

The high priest asked Stephen, "Are these charges true?"

Stephen began to speak. He told the stories of Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, and Moses. Stephen also spoke about King David and King Solomon. Then Stephen told the Jewish leaders how they had been the ones to kill Jesus, the Righteous One of God. The leaders were furious!

When the crowd heard Stephen, they became angry! Stephen, however, was filled with the Holy Spirit. He looked into heaven and exclaimed, "Look! I see heaven opened and Jesus standing at God's right hand!"

The people screamed, covered their ears, and ran up to Stephen. They dragged him out of the city and began to throw stones at him. Stephen prayed and asked God to forgive the people.

Then Stephen died.
