### **1069 Blessings**

The Meals on Wheels Program is a service project of the Deacons Committee of Hickory United EPC. In 2021, 34 volunteers as young as 10 years old and up into their 90's were involved in delivering meals to those who are unable to make meals for themselves. The meals are prepared 5 days a week at the Community Meals on Wheels Kitchen at the McDonald Presbyterian Church. Hot meals and bagged items are picked up by faithful volunteers and personally delivered to the home of the recipients for a noontime meal.

In 2021, 17 individuals received meals along the Hickory route. Throughout the year, a total of 1069 meals were delivered! In addition to receiving the meal, a short visit with the volunteers brightens the day for those who are often homebound or living alone. Client needs change frequently and are added and removed as needed. The daily count fluctuated from 2 to 11 meals a day!

Thank you to every individual who has volunteered with Meals on Wheels during 2021.

We were so happy that we could return to in-person learning in January. We sure do miss the students when we need to learn remotely. Please pray that we can continue to meet in person in the months ahead.



#### HAITI UPDATE

December 2, 2021

Haiti continues to struggle with gangs and crime. Roads are blocked, cargo was stolen, drivers were kidnapped. The Haitians are struggling, but their faith is strong. And they thank Jesus when there is a food distribution and when their children go to school and receive an education in a safe environment.


### It's Been An Awesome Journey!

Dear Friends, December, 2021

Don and I have both <u>loved</u> our time with Campus Crusade for Christ. Dr. Bright, Cru's founder, challenged people to come help change the world and he was used by God to touch the lives of many. I joined Cru in 1974 after graduating from Auburn University and being involved in the ministry there. Don joined in 1976 after growing spiritually through the Cru ministry at Penn State. These life-altering decisions began an incredible journey.

Though dubious about the idea of support-raising, our parents – Lane and Jean Thigpen and John and Dorothy Roths (all with the Lord now) had the courage to trust God and allow us to move forward. We thank the Lord for them!

Many of you became a part of our financial and prayer support teams and have partnered with us for almost 48 years for me and 46 for Don. WOW! We are humbled and blessed that God used you to sustain us during this journey.



### You have been a part of everything we have done! A few of the things you have contributed to include . . .

- Producing disciples at the University of Iowa, Tulane University, Buffalo State University, Syracuse University, and the University of Florida.
- Helping to organize "Here's Life Buffalo", where 170 churches reached out to 82,363 people with the Gospel.
- Implementing the same strategy in the seven largest cities in Zambia, where the members of 50 churches in each city were trained to share the Gospel during their three week "Ninsanga" (I Found It) Campaign.
- Translating the JESUS Film into the 7 major languages of Zambia and showing it to enormous crowds. Don personally showed the JESUS film to 110,980 people in the city of Mufulira in just a 3-month month period.
- Helping to organize the Manila 1990 outreach, where 10,000 international missionaries came to help reach the mega-city. Don was responsible for 52 international special ministry sports teams, music groups, Josh McDowell, Andre Kole, and other speakers who conducted 435 evangelistic events attended by 192,174 people.

- Pioneering a university ministry in the atheistic Czech Republic once the Iron Curtain fell.
- Coordinating the use of the JESUS film in Central Asia and the Pacific, where the objective was to show the film to 1.5 billion people, including 600 million Hindus, 330 million Muslims, and 100 million Buddhists.
- Providing leadership to Cru's ministry in Nepal, Myanmar, North India, West India, and North-central India, while seeking to open the ministry in Afghanistan and the Maldives.
- Implementing the "Youth at the CrossRoads" strategy in India, Tonga, Fiji, and Papua New Guinea to train secular teachers to teach about HIV/AIDS using a morals-based approach as exemplified by the person of Jesus.
- Pioneering new Cru ministries in Vanuatu and New Caledonia.

After several changes to our ending date, we will be fully retired from our Cru position by January 10, 2022, but will continue to remain connected to the organization as "Emeritus" staff. We will retain our Cru email addresses. Any remaining funds in our staff account can be used by us to participate in future ministry activities with Cru.

You should stop sending in contributions for us this month. If you would like to re-direct your support to another Cru staff member (and we highly recommend it) please let us know and we will connect you. We recommend two options:

- Soi and Fataki Finau are an indigenous Pacific Islands couple from Tonga who will be taking over our Pacific Island responsibilities.
- Amy (Fahringer) Staszko is a Cru staff member from the Pittsburgh area, who works with university students.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION (for those who give through a recurring automatic bank withdrawal or credit card gift)

A recurring gift to Cru for us will not stop automatically! Please contact Cru (rather than your bank or credit card company) to STOP or REDIRECT your automatic gift. For legal and privacy reasons, we are not authorized to make changes on your behalf. If you do not contact Cru, the automatic giving continues.

### KREPPS COVERED BRIDGE FESTIVAL UPDATE

The 2021 Krepps Covered Bridge Festival was held September 18-19 after a year of absence resulting from COVID-19 restrictions in 2020. Due to continuing concerns about COVID, but optimism about the prospect of great weather and people anxious to get outside after being cooped up for over a year, we were uncertain about how many guests we might see. This made planning, especially for food, difficult. We also experienced problems with obtaining supplies. However, with the extraordinary effort of Sheri Strnisa and her crew, everything went smoothly at the Festival.

We had a great turnout of vendors, many of them with us for the first time. All that we talked to were happy with the arrangements and were doing at least as well as they expected; many were doing much better. Also for the first time, we hosted a light artillery Civil War reenactment unit that provided periodic demonstrations of artillery fire, including allowing guests to participate in the firing exercises.

I appreciate all the volunteers who helped set up and take down all of the tents, tables, hay bales, stage decorations, and so many other things. I also appreciate those who worked at the food tent, Kids Zone, and other venues. A special shout out goes to the team leaders who organized and carried out their areas of responsibility: Sheri Strnisa and crew - Food, Natalie and Jake Carter - Kids Zone, Dan Bender - Youth Activities, Suzanne Stewart - Vendors, Marilyn Grove and Barb Rea - Silent Auction, Kathy and George Yonker - Site Layout and Car Show, Lois Templeton and crew - Stage Decorations, Fred Rasel - Security, John Coulter and Jill and Don Ricetti - Civil War and Age of Discovery Reenactors, Josh Strnisa and Gary Klimek - General Oversight and First Aid, and Jim Marstellar, Bob Carter, Jake Carter, and Blake Grove - Set Up and Take Down. Donations of food and other items continue to be an important way of reducing costs—THANK YOU.

We had a total of 1248 guests for the two days. This is the lowest number that we have hosted since we started actual counting about eight years ago. After talking to other covered bridge venues that also experienced reduced turnout, we conclude that the very warm, humid weather and continuing concerns about COVID affected attendance. We also did not advertise as much as we had in the past.

We featured great onstage performers, including Fred Barton, the Berean Fellowship Praise Band, Hat Trick, Hickory United E.P.C. Praise Band, Echo Valley Blue Grass Band, and Mansfield Five. And, for the second time,

our Boy Scout Troop provided an inspiring flag retirement ceremony following the Sunday morning service. Speaking of the service, I saw many unfamiliar faces—how many did you say "Hello" to? We had four antique tractors, including Jake Carter who provided hayrides throughout the Festival on Saturday, and 30 antique and classic cars and trucks on Sunday.

So, how did we do financially? We had a gross income of \$17,622 and a net profit of \$7,350. In the grey box to the right, is a comparison with previous years.

So, where do we go from here? If the effort and hard work are worth it, we believe that the objective must be to build God's Kingdom. This means that we need to take maximum advantage of the opportunity to reach between 1200 and 3000 guests with a message of the Gospel and God's love for them. In the near future, the Session will be deciding if we will continue hosting the Krepps Covered Bridge Festival. Toward that end, we welcome your comments and suggestions, especially in writing.
