Elementary Crew Leader- (5) Leads a small group of elementary-age kids. There's no preparation required. A good crew leader is a friend and helper for the kids and station leaders. They ask questions, take kids seriously and encourage them throughout VBS.

Preschool Crew Leader- (6) Lead a crew of small groups of preschool-age kids. There's no preparation required. A preschool good crew leader is a friend and helper for the kids and station leaders. They ask questions, take kids seriously and encourage them throughout VBS.




I am very delighted to announce to you that we made more progress after the last graduation ceremony at the Technical School. A lot of youths in LaCroix were motivated to come and learn a skill. They have seen the success of the students who graduated last February and they also found a way to earn a living. This motivation encouraged the administration staff to add new skills to the list like electricity, plumbing, and building construction. We will start with the registration in a few days. We thank God for all because one of the mission goals is to help every young person have a profession and we keep praying to God for that.



MOBILE CLINIC

With the collaboration of some nurses from the mission medical clinic, we were able to restart the mobile clinic. We had a mobile clinic in Pacot last week (one of the poorest neighborhoods of LaCroix). We served many people who are in need and among them were widows, disabled persons, and orphans. Many folks cannot afford the medical clinic fees due to their very precarious economic situation. Restarting the mobile clinic came to my mind after visiting and bringing food to the widows,

widowers, and disabled people in several villages. Subsequently, I was accompanied by nurses to help them, especially in their cases of high blood pressure. I finally realized that the need is greater than that. Many sick people stay at home without going to the hospital, and young women between six and eight months of pregnancy have never been to the hospital. The needs are enormous. According to our medical team, there are young people who are hypertensive and who show signs of diabetes. Others have respiratory tract infections. Let me remind you, that despite the low cost to access the services of the Mission Clinic, these people could not afford it. As a self-sufficient clinic, we cannot exempt all of these people.

I was born in Joinisse, LaCroix. I have attended school at NTM since my childhood and I am currently in 7th grade. I am a twin and I have 4 siblings, 2 girls, and 2 boys. I am out of words to express my joy to be among the students presenting in the Zoom-in program, this week. I would like to tell you a little bit about what happened to my sisters and me. A few years ago, my sisters and I were sick for several months with a disease. Despite going to the hospital to get better, we were still the same as when we went in until somebody spoke with my mother and she realized it was not normal and she brought us to the New Testament Church in order to get a solution. When we got to the church the

receptionist welcomed us. My mother asked the Pastor to pray for us and while the pastor was praying for us I felt something strange happening in me and we have received complete healing. Since that time we have been believers and I am very proud to tell what the Lord has done for us. I like to tell stories about God and my studies with some of my classmates and that's why they call me "Missionary". At first, I used to be mad at them until I understood what it meant to be a missionary and I am not mad at them anymore. I thank my sponsors, Mrs. & Mr. Garald & Mary Ann McDonald for their support of my education. You are in my prayers daily!!

Arianna - I have been asking for people to pray for Arianna all year. She came to Kutztown totally unfamiliar with the Bible and knew almost nothing about God. 

"A few weeks before Women's Conference someone asked me: why God should let you into heaven? " "I had no idea how to answer that question. Now I know that the only way to heaven is through Jesus' death in my place. " In just a few short weeks Daisy's perspective had totally changed and she has since

devoured the Bible and is even doing outreach on campus!





We leave for Focus this Saturday, and we'll be gone for 2 weeks as a family so you can pray for us as we balance caring for our kids and serving at the event.

Kaylah will be teaching a workshop on Gossip and Caleb will be teaching one on Hospitality, leading worship throughout each week, and overseeing AV as usual. We have goals set to meet new students each day and hope to have some significant conversations with students while we're there.
