
From the Media Messenger...

Dead Silence by Robin Caroll

Elise, a single mom of a deaf son, has a job as a court sign language interpreter. Reading lips comes natural for her. When leaving the courtroom she reads the lips of someone discussing a planned attempt on the life of the state senator, who happens to be her mother-in-law. Before she can act on this information she receives a call from her son's caregiver saying he has fallen at the playground and is being taken to the hospital by ambulance. In the chaos that ensues she forgets about what she overheard until she hears the morning news broadcasting the death of her mother-in-law. Elise reports the incident to the FBI, but finds that she has put herself and her son in danger. The book continues the story from there.

The book has a great plot. I really enjoyed it, but the author could have done a better job developing Elise's character. Elise works in the courts, yet she makes some questionable decisions. Her son was not severely injured and she totally forgets about a murder plot involving a family member. There are other incidents that she fails to report to the police. For someone involved in the legal process on a daily basis her judgement seems poor.

Even so, it is an interesting mystery with lots of twists and turns. There are many references to biblical passages and Elise is struggling with her faith. It is a clean Christian based novel.




