



## An update from "The Pond" (Meridzo Center Development Corporation) in Lynch, Kentucky -Eric & Sissy Rutherford



Seven weeks to the day after losing my dad, my mom went to join him in glory. I had the honor of preaching both of their services, which were both opportunities to share the eternal promises of God with my family, as well as my parents' many friends and neighbors who attended. We lost Sissy's mom last year and one our coffee shop regulars who had become a dear friend in between. It has been a tough year, but we take solace in knowing that all of them are home now in the presence of the Lord.

We've also been touched by the losses at GCBC since moving here, especially of late. We mourn with you; and send our love and sincere condolences to those who have lost family and friends.

We have spent the last several weeks preparing for another year of ministry here. Our roles have expanded to include more mentoring; something that will also be required of those with whom we serve so we organized and hosted a "weekend" of sorts for our staff members and us to learn more about becoming Biblical, fruit-bearing disciples. It was led by Denley Caughman, who many of you will remember as the Pastor of Garden City Baptist Church for 22 years. He was my first Pastor and he and his wife Ann are still friends and mentors to both me and Sissy.

We have also been working alongside Morgan, the young lady handling the daily operations of the Lamp House Coffee shop, and her husband Luke. They've revamped the coffee shop menu and décor and recently hired their staff, providing three more local jobs, and hosted two soft openings to get their newbies some practice. The shop has been closed since November for renovations and for all of us to get some things in order, so we are excited for the grand re-opening on February 28th.

I've also joined a new, men's Bible Study led by Drew Baldwin (our ministry's CEO and Pastor at Eolia Baptist Church where we have been going). Sissy is taking art classes with Black Mountain Arts, a new branch of the ministry run by another couple offering free music and art classes. In recent years Sissy started making crafts and some popular painted art pieces that she's sold in the coffee shop with proceeds going to the ministry. She's quite talented and the classes are helping her hone her skills.



Earlier this week I met with two deacons at Flat Gap Missionary Baptist Church, a small SBC church in Pound, Va. whose Pastor needs help due to some age-related health issues. I will be doing some pulpit supply for them starting Sunday. Then the on March 6<sup>th</sup> I will be helping YOU kick off Missions Month at GCBC. Sissy and I are excited we were invited to come share a brief update on our ministry and bring the message on that Sunday. We look forward to seeing you all!
