



In-Person Worship: Due to social distancing, services are limited to 50 people and require weekly pre-registration, which begins Mondays at 9am and closes 24 hours before the start of the service. **Online Services** are at 8am for those unable to be here in person. Adult Bible Study live-streams at 9:15am. Contact the church office with questions.
Pre-registration is important to guarantee yourself an available seat, to allow us to print the appropriate number of bulletins without excessive waste, to plan for seating arrangements when services are near capacity, and to quickly notify people in the event of COVID exposure.
