



Libertas Christian School Community Update

This past summer launched our first annual student leadership training for our house program at Libertas and we longed for prayer to play a major role in how our students helped govern themselves and mentor other students. Our 4th grade teacher, Mrs. Carianne Robbins, graciously developed a workshop to teach our

leadership students about ACTS prayer: adoration, confession,

thanksgiving, and supplication (along with intercession). Several of the students were familiar with this method of prayer from their family devotions and prayer time at church but the method was new for many.



You may wonder how this focus on prayer has impacted our school. Each Monday

morning, upper school students gather in the gym to begin the day with worship and prayer. After Mr. Nemec and the worship team lead us in song, students disperse and gather in small groups around the gym. Each group begins by adoring God, simply praising Him for His attributes and goodness. Next, students move into confession and humbly admit before God



and others how we have fallen short. Thanksgiving brings sweet and ready prayers as students offer to God their gratitude and thanks for how He answers prayer, provides, and sustains. Last, we move into intercession and

supplication. All around the gym you can hear young men and women praying for the world, their nation, their parents and families, and the needs of others in our community. Aliz Pusztai, a 10th



grade student,

shares: "I have really enjoyed the bond it has created and the way it has made us be pushed out of our comfort zone. Praying properly is key and this has certainly taught every one of us how." What a blessing for our students to grow

in intentional prayer!

John Piper notes that, "Prayer is the open admission that without Christ we can do nothing." We believe this at Libertas. A right understanding of God permeates a well-rounded liberal arts education and our Monday morning prayer time allows our staff and student body time to contemplate the eternal and set our hearts on Him. May it help our students grow in their desire to know, love, and serve the living God.

Greetings to the Libertas Family,

First allow me to say thanks for the privilege of joining this amazing family. Ruth and I have watched from afar for several years and marveled with you as God gathered, guarded, and guided this ministry. My commitment to Christian classical

education is one of studied conviction. That journey cannot be shared in a brief document but maybe if my service here extends beyond the current plan, I can share more of how God has moved in my personal and professional quest.

Allow me now to introduce myself and my family. Ruth and I have been married for 42 years. God has graced our family with four children. One is in heaven and three are now married and have added to our lives the excitement of ten GRANDchildren. Rebekah and Elizabeth are graduates of Freedom Christian and Jonathan is a US Army 10th Mountain Division veteran. Each brought a spouse to our family that has enriched and blessed us beyond measure. Rebekah's husband Kevin is an emergency physician in Green Bay, WI and they have two preschool sons, Cooper and Caleb. Elizabeth and her husband Jeff live in Torrington, WY where Jeff is a police officer. He serves as the SRO for the schools. What is Happening at Libertas?

Thank you for checking in with us through this Community Update Newsletter. There has been a lot going on here at Libertas. Following is a recap of events for the last couple of months.

In March of 2020, the Michigan Governor, Gretchen Whitmer, ordered all schools to be closed for two weeks due to Covid-19. We quickly made adjustments to temporary online virtual learning. Our teachers, staff, and families did an amazing job transitioning to this new method. Two weeks later, it was determined that all schools be closed through the end of the school year.

As summer progressed, our governor issued an increasing number of executive orders involving masks, social distancing, and health practices. Our school board sought counsel on best practices to address health concerns without violating the civil liberties of families who strongly disagreed with the government overreach in the matters of our health and educating our children. We started our school year with new cleaning protocols throughout our campus. Parents were given the option to sign a mask waiver or send their students masked. 100% of our parents signed the mask waiver to allow their children to attend Libertas without the use of face coverings. We also chose to not participate with "contact tracing" per the conviction that we were a private institution that was not required to follow the same rules as public institutions.

The Michigan Supreme Court, in early October 2020, ruled that all of the executive orders that Governor Whitmer had issued since April 28, were unconstitutional. As a result, new orders of closures were issued through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. As Libertas refused to follow these unconstitutional rules, the health department proceeded with threats of closure of our school. We, therefore, filed a lawsuit against the governor, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Ottawa County Health Department for violation

of civil liberties. In retaliation, our county health department quarantined our entire school building for two weeks, citing a "Coronavirus Outbreak." despite there being no school associated COVID-19 cases.

Libertas quickly submitted a request for an emergency injunction to the western district federal court, which was denied. We appealed to the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals,, which was ruled that because we complied with the closing of the school, we were in no need of an injunction.


Finally, in order to remain open to in-person instruction, Libertas chose to move forward in compliance with the rules of the governor and health department regarding masks and contact tracing. After that announcement, several families chose to withdraw. This has resulted in a considerable budget shortfall. We have been blessed with a fruitful year-end giving campaign, but are looking to see how and where the Lord will bless us as we begin our second semester of school.

The full student body has been present for in-person instruction since January 4, 2021. The students have been very thankful to be together. Just like everywhere in our culture, the mask issue has caused tension among our kids and community. Libertas faculty and staff work through these challenges by pointing the kids to God's Word. We are all working together to learn how to honor the Lord in a time where society is wanting us to rely on manmade things to "save" us. This is a struggle all of us are trying to figure out.

Join us in prayer for the students as they work to extend grace to fellow people who may believe differently, while also standing strong in their own convictions from the Lord. Included in this newsletter are prayer calendars. Please place them on your refrigerator or in your Bible, as to be reminded to lift Libertas in prayer on a daily basis.
