Right and Wrong Justice and Injustice Judgment and Blessing

Isaiah 5:20 "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter."

1. There are moral absolute standards 2. God sets those standards – right and wrong 3. God has revealed those standards to US

4. When we re-define or otherwise change His standards, we are guilty of slandering Almighty God, sitting in judgment of God and therefore, blasphemy, having made ourselves gods and the judge of God.

5. We can't judge God or His ways according to our sense of timing – or our present frame of reference

• "It's futile to serve God. What do we gain?" – v.14 • "the arrogant are blessed" "evildoers prosper" – v.14 Why do bad things happen to good people? I've tried to serve God and yet ...

"Surely the day is coming" – 4:1: 3:18

Living in the fear of the Lord and living to honor the Lord is absolutely the way to go – 3:16,17

To see the circumstances of our lives <u>correctly</u> – everything, including good and evil, justice and injustice, judgment and blessing – we have to see it all from an eternal perspective.
