Dear Friend,

I am writing to you with a heart of sincere compassion. The losses in our lives are too numerous to count, and walking by faith doesn't lessen the pain. Yet there is abundant hope, and I wanted to share with you what the Lord has been teaching me through this time.

Our study this past season took us verse by verse through Psalm 23. Reminding us that He is our Shepherd and He is with us. Teaching us to listen to His voice above all the noise of the world. Letting Him give us rest and restore our souls.

However, the phrase that impacted me the most from the scripture was from verse 3, that He leads me in the paths of righteousness *"for His name's sake."* These four words define the goal of our lives- His glory. This simple phrase captures the purpose of history, the reason we are here today and the hope we have for the future. He will be glorified in all things.

The platform of sports provides many opportunities to give glory to God. Every touchdown, homerun and championship win for whatever sport has the moment of glory and the post-game interview where credit can be given where credit is due.

Jesus had a lot of glory moments that weren't so glorious. He surrendered to His Father's plan for His Father's glory in the Garden of Gethsemane before His death.

He was betrayed, deserted, beaten and humiliated, and to all those around Him, He was losing. The Good Shepherd was laying His life down for His sheep.

No one wants to lose- whether it be a game, a job or the life of a loved one, and yet life itself is full of losses. So I want to encourage you with a truth that you've probably heard before: We are on the winning team. There is not a lot of room for discussion during a game, or even a practice. “Coach says,” are two of the most powerful words in any language, and the usual “protocol” is to DO WHAT THE COACH SAYS RIGHT AWAY NO QUESTIONS ASKED! When we look at the life and words of Jesus, we would agree that whatever “Jesus says” should be our true priority! He shared parables, taught the Sermon on the Mount, told of the coming kingdom, yet He also asked over 300 questions throughout the four gospels. He asked, not because He didn’t know the answers, but because He wanted to get to the heart of His listeners. We have the opportunity to listen and to respond as well.

We all have questions in this life, especially during difficult times, but answering the questions of Jesus transforms our hearts, convicts us, grounds us, heals us and reveals the things we need to see so we can grow.

Over the next few weeks we will focus on just a few of Jesus’ questions! Be sure to write down your answers in this magazine journal or in whatever notebook you usually use.



“Who do they say the Son of Man is? Who do you say that I am?”

M a t t h e w 16:13 - 17

Matthew 16 is full of conversations and questions with both the Pharisees and then later with the disciples. In verse 15, Jesus challenges His followers to answer a crucial question about His identity for themselves- not based on what other people were saying, but on their own personal conviction. It is essential that we stop and take this to heart, because our answer to this question will be the core, the foundation and the expression of our faith. How would you articulate who Jesus is to someone else? How would you describe His character?

READ: John 1

“Jesus asks the two blind men: “What do you want me to do for you?” (Matthew 20:32) Jesus continues to interact with different people, speaking truth, healing hearts and illnesses and this passage in Matthew 20 is just one of many instances. The beauty of this question is that Jesus knew the answer, but invited these men to ask. If you have ever felt like God wouldn’t want to listen to your prayers, let this scripture encourage you to believe otherwise. He knows what we need, but even still, He wants us to ask. What are you worried about? What do you want the Lord to do for you?

READ: Philippians 4:4-7

L u k e 2 4 : 3 6 - 5 3

Jesus asks His disciples after His resurrection: “Why are you troubled and why do doubts arise in your hearts?” (Luke 24:38) You can imagine the heartbreak of Jesus’ followers when He was crucified and buried. Even after all Jesus had said and done to prepare them for that moment, their fear and grief became greater than the truths they had been taught. This question is both powerful and kind because Jesus knew their hearts, acknowledged their pain, and yet gently convicted them of their unbelief by asking WHY they were even struggling. We all go through dark times and lose hope, and it is easy to forget God’s character and His promises. This question is one we can ask ourselves today. What are your doubts and frustrations? What is heavy on your heart?

READ: PSALM 40

“My God, My God, why have You forsaken me?”

M a r k 1 5 : 3 4

There are 7 things that Jesus said on the cross: Six statements. One question. Through this one question, we can understand more fully what it cost Jesus to take our place on the cross. Nothing was more painful to Him than the separation from His Father.

“My God, My God, why have You forsaken me?” To “forsake” means to “renounce or turn away from entirely.” A synonym would be to “abandon”, to leave someone helpless without protection- to leave without intending to return.

Imagine the anguish Jesus was experiencing when He cried out this question to His Father. We often think of Christ’s suffering as the physical pain of the crucifixion, but Jesus’ death on the cross was a cosmic death, meaning that so much more was happening than what the eye could see.

- Jesus was bearing our specific sins, past, present and future.
- Jesus was dying an infinite death, atoning for all sin, for all time.
- Jesus was truly abandoned. When Jesus took all of our sin upon Himself, God had to turn His back on His Son because He is holy and cannot be united with sin.
- Jesus was fulfilling prophecy when He was alienated from God the Father.

No human being could undergo what Jesus did- a suffering beyond the physical, the weight of the sins of the world being atoned for as He took our place. All the pain and punishment concentrated into the three hour period when God the Father turned away. (Matthew 27:45-56) God’s holiness and justice demanded punishment- and only Jesus could bear it.

“The hard reality is this: if Jesus was not forsaken on the cross, we are still in our sins. We have no redemption, no salvation. The whole point of the cross was for Jesus to bear our sins and bear the sanctions of the covenant. In order to do that, He had to be forsaken. Jesus submitted Himself to His Father’s will and endured the curse, that we, His people, might experience the ultimate blessedness.” - R.C. Sproul

Lessons from the Baseball Field

“Every coach wants a green field. This requires constant fertilizing and watering, and lots of hands to make it work. I trained the team to take care of the field daily- after every game and every practice. Everyone was in charge of their position, and of course teaching the kids to work made the boosters proud! If we didn’t keep on top of it, we would need a massive work day to catch up, and that’s what happens in our spiritual lives. We wonder why don’t we have strength, and we notice that weeds have been growing. We don’t have the nutrients we need. Caring for the field has to be a daily commitment. This is the way it is with God’s Word, and it is important to teach this to our kids as well.

Then they will know where to find strength and how to feed themselves throughout life.” -Coach Danny Wild

Cindy Wild, one of our CWM mentors, and her husband Danny have been a coaching couple for 42 years. Danny had been a head baseball coach for decades, and throughout the years of his career, he would often take drastic measures to keep the teams playing and the fans cheering. Pools of water and gopher holes were common challenges that could have led to injury and canceled games, so he says that caring for a baseball field is about “problem solving and making adjustments.” One example of this occurred in the Spring of 1986.

Danny’s home field was known for hosting an annual tournament that brought in scouts and teams from everywhere. In an effort to dry out the field a few days before, Danny covered the infield in gasoline and set it on fire. The firemen came, but did not press charges, just issued this warning: “Coach Wild, just let us know before you do that next time.” They witnessed his commitment to his team, so they knew that there would be a next time.

We don’t often think about the work required to cultivate and maintain a baseball field. Grading, raking, dragging the field. Smoothing the batter’s box. Mowing the grass. There is a never-ending, ever-changing to-do list, and it’s almost impossible to hide neglect and laziness. Spiritually speaking, we can learn a lot from the process and strategy it takes to have a beautiful field.

- It’s not easy, and growth does not happen by chance!
- It is a daily commitment
- It’s meant to happen in community
- It’s God’s Word that gives us the nutrients we need

As you apply these lessons to your heart, consider these things:

- Are you committed to daily time with the Lord in His Word?
- Are you walking in community with other believers who are helping you grow?
- Do you want to mature in Christ, but are not sure how to have a consistent, intentional plan?

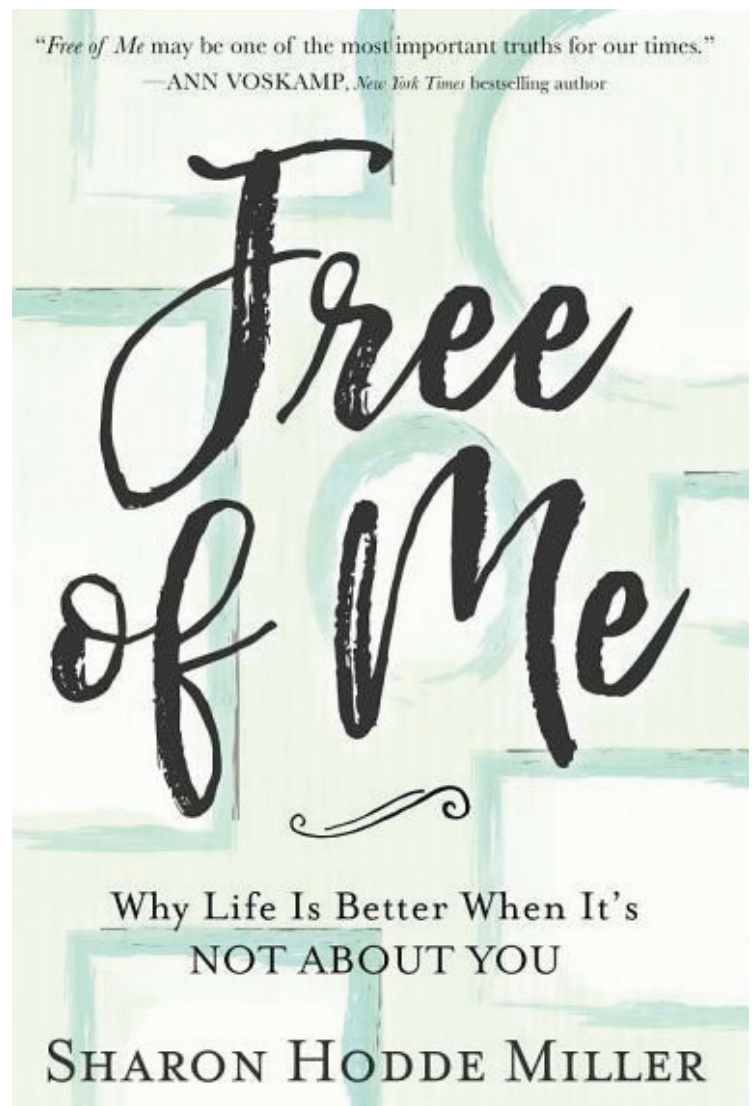
