Creation - Genesis 1-3: God's spirit hovers over chaotic waters. God creates a space where life can flourish out of the waters (Genesis 1:1-2). But in Genesis 3, humanity unleashes chaos back into the world, and this is the beginning of the pattern of **God rescuing a remnant that will pass through the waters and emerge out the other side to inhabit a new creation**.
