Baptism in the New Testament church is described as

- *the beginning of discipleship (Matthew 28:18-19)*
- *dying & rising with Christ (Romans 6:3-4),*
- *washing away of sin (1 Corinthians 6:11),*
- *as a new birth or rebirth (John 3:5, Acts 2:38),*
- *inclusion in and united with Christ & with each other in the church (Ephesians 2:19),*
- *new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17-18).*
